

# LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF VICTORIA

### NOTICES OF MOTION

- 1 MR CATHIE—To move, That this House expresses its concern at the failure of the Commonwealth Government to provide sufficient funds for public housing in Victoria to alleviate the pressing social and economic problems in this State and supports the call of the Victorian Minister of Housing for the Commonwealth Government to double its funding this year.
