I have been stationed at various stations within the metropolitan area and are currently at Broadmeadows Fire station. I live in a small town about 1 hour north of Melbourne so I know how important volunteers are whether they be cfa, st johns, lions club, rsl or your local sports clubs. About 15 years ago I volunteered to run the bar at the local football club which I did for 3 years until the club grew to a size that I couldn't do the job efficiently enough with the demand from the public. The club decided to employ and pay a full time barman which as it turned out was more profitable for the club, gave a community member employment and kept the supporters happy. My point is Melbourne has expanded a great deal and the population is expected to double over the next 25 years.
