Fire Services Bill Select Committee

Dear Members,

I write this submission in support of the proposed bill that has been introduced by the Andrews Government.

I have been involved if firefighting since early 1984 until present, with my service being as follows.

- CFA Volunteer, 1/1984 1/1996, 6/2005 present
- Air Services Australia, 1/1986 1/1988
- MFB, 1/1988 12/1998
- Broadspectrum Fire & Rescue, 12/2015 present

In this time, I have seen considerable changes to the fire services that serve the state of Victoria. The demands that are being placed on the service are for ever increasing and the time that is required from a volunteer is also dramatically increasing.

From the information that I have been able to view, the proposed changes will not have any adverse effect on the provision of the required service. These proposed changes will only increase the protection to the people of Victoria.

At the present time, there is no guarantee that volunteers will be able to respond, I have seen this regularly with the local brigade that I volunteer with. Many times, I have responded to the station waiting for a crew to arrive, for which they do not come. This is more evident during business hours when volunteers are at work. Only this week, I responded to an automatic fire alarm in the truck by myself after the Brigade Captain called me on my phone to advise that he would meet me at the location. I was on scene for several minutes before his arrival.

The VFBV which claims to represent approximately 60000 volunteers, but does not have individual membership, only brigade membership, does not represent the views of the greater community. In the 33 years of my firefighting, I have witnessed them trying to push back on change being introduced due to "tradition". The time has come for these changes to be introduced with the full support of the parliament.

Whilst this submission is short, I would be happy to appear in front of the Select Committee to further explain my thoughts and reasons behind my views.
