SUBMISSION TO THE FIRE SERVICES LEGISLATION REFORM PARLIAMENTARY COMMITTEE

To members of the Parliamentary Committee,

Thank-you for the opportunity to provide information which I am confident you shall find useful.

I have been a career fire-fighter since joining the MFB in 1986. I was fortunate enough to be involved in an International Exchange Program in 1993 to the city of Newcastle-Upon-Tyne, England, where I worked for a period of 12 months as a firefighter. During this time, I made a number of observations, one of which included the fact they had 9 fire-fighters on the fire ground at that time, comprising 1 appliance containing 5 members; the second appliance containing 4 members. This structure enabled implementation of safe and comprehensive fire-fighting operations to occur. This was identified in the early 90's as a suitable number to address the risks that were presented to them. I believe 20 odd years later in a State where our population is growing at approximately 100,000 people, the requirement to have 7 career fire-fighters on the fire-ground would be a minimum standard to have the ability to implement a basic incident management structure, which should provide safety to all fire-fighters on scene at incidents.

During my career, I have also had the opportunity to work within the CFA for the last two years as a Station officer at Mildura, in District 18. Mildura is an integrated station working with 7 CFA Volunteer Brigades. My experience has been one of trying to set a framework to develop relationships which are resilient, educational, supportive and respectful of the roles we all need to fill to provide the state with a comprehensive and trusted brand that the community will feel supported and safe.

A recent example of interoperability working at its best was a fire at an almond hull storage plant, upon arrival volunteer brigade had initiated fire-fighting strategies; I worked with the Captain in trying to achieve a strategy to contain and suppress the fire which involved approximately 3 acres of almond hulls in rows of which 80% were on fire. As the incident escalated, council personnel, other agencies and Senior CFA Officers were involved. The fire took 3 days to bring under control and extinguish, in which time numerous volunteer members from around the district attended, working together with a common purpose of the safety for the community and businesses in a well-structured manner.

I have been asked by numerous volunteers, whether the impact of a restructure will be of a negative nature to their brigades, and I have been able to explain the same fire-fighting structure that exists now for volunteers will be unchanged going forward. Also, I have received feedback from numerous volunteers who feel the restructure will be a positive for their brigades, as they can see a well-structured career model will flow on and create certainty, stability and framework for their brigades. As outlined, the information being delivered needs to be of a positive and factual nature which will give certainty and provide a sense of positivity within the brigades.
