


Portfolio objectives

- Affordable, reliable and sustainable energy for Victorians
- Foster the efficient and responsible development of Victoria's earth resources



State Budget 2012-13



Note: excludes depreciation and capital asset charge



State Budget 2012-13

- Safer Electricity Assets Workplan
- \$62.5m to progressively replace most dangerous power lines
- Advanced Metering Infrastructure
- \$19.8m to implement Auditor-General's recommendations
- Facilitating Low Emission Transition
- \$9.5m to manage risks related to the introduction of the carbon tax
- Australian Energy Market Commission
- \$4.5m for Victoria's support to help ensure efficient, reliable and secure energy markets for consumers






Impact of carbon pricing

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Carbon Tax Estimates

Carbon Tax = \$25/tonne Emissions intensity 1.3t/MWh 70% pass through of carbon tax impost GST

Example:

Customer	Electricity used (KWh)	Current average bill	Bill w. carbon tax @ \$25/t	Net Increase
Melb residence with gas hot water	4,700	\$1,306	\$1,435	\$129 (9.9%)
