Chronology of primary and secondary school closures in Victoria due to COVID-19

This chronology charts the cessation and resumption of on-site learning for Victorian government primary and secondary schools between March 2020 and November 2021. In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the school year was modified in an attempt to reduce in-person gatherings and movement across the state. Using predominantly government media releases, as well as information from the Department of Education, Skills and Employment, the chronology maps the changes to the school year—from the initial transition from on-site learning to remote learning, and then the resumption of on-site learning, in Victorian schools.
