Photographs and videos stored, allowing intelligence tool to identify persons of interest and share data with multiple agencies

Intelligence collated more quickly from expanded data holdings, allowing for:

- A faster more accurate response
- Preventative analysis to predict and stop crimes
- Perform network analysis of organised crime and terrorist activities





Delivering the resources Victoria Police need

- \$596 million Public Safety Package gives police the resources they need to respond to gang-related crime, gun crime, terrorist threats, and family violence.
- 300 frontline police to be deployed across Victoria
- 106 specialist police officers
- 52 specialist and support personnel
- Equipment and technology

Delivering for regional Victoria

- The Public Safety Package includes \$36.8 million to replace and refurbish police stations across regional Victoria:
 - \$30 million to replace outdated facilities at Colac, Murtoa, Bright, Warburton, Mallacoota, Cowes and Corryong
 - \$2.94 million to refurbish 15 police stations at Bacchus Marsh, Bairnsdale, Benalla, Churchill, Cobden, Geelong, Lakes Entrance, Maffra, Moe, Mount Buller, Portland, Rosebud, Sorrento, Warragul and Warrnambool
 - \$3.9 million to replace and refurbish 10 police residences across Victoria.

Community Crime Prevention

- The Community Crime Prevention Program provides a package of grants programs to build community engagement and capability in evidence-based crime prevention.
- \$19.4 million over two years renews the Community Crime Prevention Program with increased emphasis on addressing the root causes of crime

Counter-Terrorism

- \$62.9 million over five years to strengthen Victoria's counter terrorism capability and capacity response
 - \$60.9 million will fund an additional 40 sworn officers and 48 specialist staff
 - \$2 million for specialist equipment for counter terrorism activities
