RECOMMENDATIONS



1. That the Victorian Government funds a comprehensive, State-wide threatened species recovery program.
2. That, in the absence of a State Government run threatened species recovery program, a program is run by an independent non-government body.
3. That Zoos Victoria, the Royal Botanic Gardens Victoria and the research sector are adequately funded to run and maintain *ex-situ* conservation programs.
4. That funding for the recovery of Victoria's threatened species is ongoing to address Victoria's extinction crisis into the long term.





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Recovering Australia's Threatened Flora

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The process of threatened species recovery

1. Build partnerships with key stakeholders.
2. Clarify taxonomy.
3. Survey to collect population data.
4. Identify current & potential habitat.
5. Monitor populations to determine the growth rates, viability of populations & the success of recovery actions.
6. Collect germplasm and place in long term storage (plants).
7. Assess populations and identify threats.
8. Manage threats.
9. Research: collect biological & ecological data.
10. Establish populations in cultivation or in captive breeding programs for future translocations.
11. Reintroduce species into the wild.
12. Community engagement: build community support for conservation .
