### RESPONSE

**Answer:**

Priority Primary Care Centres are now known as Urgent Care Clinics (UCCs).

UCCs operate on a hybrid funding model whereby the state and Commonwealth governments provide operational grants and patient visits are billed through the Medicare Benefits Scheme (MBS).

In 2023-24, 10 Victorian UCCs (nine existing and a new clinic established in inner Melbourne) were funded under a Federation Funding Agreement with the Commonwealth as part of the Medicare UCC program to June 2026. The Commonwealth has committed to funding a further seven existing Victorian UCCs from 2024-25 through to June 2026.

### RESPONSE

#### Answer:

The average construction cost for regional ambulance stations completed from 2019 to 2022 (calendar year; total of 9 stations) was \$6,600/m<sup>2</sup>. For those stations completed from 2023 to 2024 (calendar year; total of 9 stations) the average construction cost was \$8,400/m<sup>2</sup>. All stations in these samples are single-storey and have unique characteristics for each site.

Costs excluded in the average construction cost include:

- land and site servicing, as there is high variability between sites (e.g. some stations required land acquisition whereas others were built on an existing ambulance station site and involved demolition).
- fit-out, design and project management costs as they were managed at a program level for all sites funded prior to Armstrong Creek.

VHBA has standardised ambulance station design to drive efficiency across the program. In some instances, a bespoke solution is required due to unique requirements – as is the case for Armstrong Creek – and can result in higher design and build costs.

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### Answer:

- The Armstrong Creek Peak Period Unit is already operational, having commenced in late 2022. The team will move from its temporary base to the new branch upon completion.
- The operating hours of the new branch will be informed by operational needs in the area and will be confirmed prior to the branch opening.
- Ambulance Victoria routinely monitors demand and activity patterns and will relocate resources as necessary to maximise coverage and service availability. This will help to ensure the new Armstrong Creek branch can best meet the needs of the local community.
