The Suburban Development Story so far...

-  Metropolitan Partnerships embedded into the Victorian Government decision-making process
-  Metropolitan Partnerships Development Fund established and operational
-  Frankston and Broadmeadows Revitalisation Boards hand down reports, oversee investment in projects
-  Pick My Project successful projects now being delivered after public voting
-  Metropolitan Development Advisory Panel providing expert insights to Government
-  Delivery Coordination working across government to break down silos and coordinate collaborative approaches



Suburban Revitalisation Program – 2019-20 Budget Initiative

\$3.5 million over one year (2019-20) to support ongoing and new suburban revitalisation projects. This will include:

- Continued delivery of the Frankston Station Redevelopment Project
- Continued delivery of the Broadmeadows Revitalisation Project
- Determination of Revitalisation Projects in up to four new priority locations across remaining Metropolitan Partnership Regions (Eastern, Northern, Western and Inner Metro).

Input from Land use Framework Plans (Plan Melbourne) and Metropolitan Partnerships

Establishment & implementation of place-based Revitalisation Boards bringing together key stakeholders

Well-designed, community oriented places, enhancing liveability, social cohesion and increasing opportunity

2019-20: Continuing to deliver the Suburban Development Vision

Metropolitan Partnerships to engage communities and deliver third round of annual advice

Metropolitan Partnerships to complete first round of MPDF projects with delivery partners

Suburban Revitalisation locations to be explored for remaining four regions (East, West, North and Inner Metro)

Suburban Revitalisation to continue in Frankston and Broadmeadows, with investment in report recommendations

Pick My Project successful metropolitan projects (120 in total) to be completed by June 2020



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
