1. Can you please provide the committee with a table with a breakdown of all Royal Commission recommendations including:
 - a. Progress to implement each recommendation
 - b. Individual expected completion date for each recommendation
 - c. Responsible Minister
 - d. Initial budget to implemented each individual recommendation
 - e. Actual value of taxpayer funds so far to implement each individual recommendation?

Answer

In March 2016 Australia's first Royal Commission into Family Violence delivered its final report and made 227 recommendations. As at 1 January 2019, 120 of the 227 recommendations have been implemented and work is underway to implement the remainder. We continue to report publicly on progress. Budget is not allocated by recommendation. We have invested over \$2.7 billion in the government's first term of office, and an additional \$185.5 million has been allocated in this year's budget to support ongoing family violence reform work. This investment supports family violence service delivery, and will help shift community attitudes in relation to family violence, as well as keeping women and children safe and holding perpetrators to account.

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2. Can you please provide the committee with a whole of reform interdependency map?

Answer

Due to the complex nature of the Family Violence Reform, a risk-based approach has been adopted as a more effective method of dependency management. Identified operational dependencies are managed by relevant departments and entities, within the established governance structure.

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3. Has the government appointed a new Family Violence Implementation Monitor? If so, who is it? If not, when will the position be filled?

Answer

In accordance with the requirements of the *Family Violence Reform Implementation Monitor Act 2016*, work is progressing to ensure the appointment of a Family Violence Reform Implementation Monitor prior to the current Monitor Mr Tim Cartwright leaving the role in August 2019.
