Thank you for your letter of 28 June 2013 attaching the draft transcript of my evidence to the Committee on 26 June 2013 and seeking further information in relation to a question on notice.

The transcript requires one minor amendment to it on page 15 which I have noted and attached.

During the hearing, I took a question on notice (at page 17 of the transcript) in relation to the timeframe for responses from the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) in comparison with the previous state based boards. The tables below analyse the difference in average response times and distribution of complaints from 7 to >180 days between the state based Registration Boards and AHPRA.

Analysing data from the Dental and Medical Boards of Victoria, the response times were predominantly 7-14 days under the old system compared with 30-60 days for the Dental and Medical Boards of Australia under the national system. This covers the early period of AHPRA's establishment and the difficulties with response times when the national system was first established.
