Supporting Victoria's multicultural and faith communities by:


- celebrating cultural diversity and traditions

Portfolio investment since 2014-15

Since 2014, more than \$600 million has been invested in the Multicultural Affairs portfolio.



Achievements in the last 12 months

In 2023-24 the Multicultural Affairs portfolio has:


- delivered \$5.6 million to fund 678
 multicultural festivals and events
- provided \$8.2 million funding for 30 multicultural community infrastructure projects with more
 to be delivered
- invested **\$6 million** in community-led initiatives countering Islamophobia and antisemitism
- delivered **\$4.5 million** to enable targeted supports for Victorians of African heritage



Funding for government election commitments

Work is underway to deliver \$69.7 million in funding for election commitments including:

- **\$40 million** for improving community spaces and facilities
- \$12 million for community events
 and festivals
- \$9.8 million for the Ethnic
 Communities Council of Victoria,
 Bachar Houli Foundation, the
 Victorian African Communities
 Action Plan and multicultural
 museums
- \$6 million for anti-vilification campaigns
- \$1.5 million for multicultural media



The 2024-25 Victorian State Budget delivers

- \$5.0 million from the Multicultural Affairs portfolio for the Victorian African Communities Action Plan to deliver the successful Employment Brokers and Alcohol and Other Drugs Outreach programs
- **\$4.4 million** in support for newly arrived migrant communities, including funding for

- Community Hubs and Refugee Legal
- \$4 million for antivilification measures to support release of Victoria's first Anti-Racism Strategy
