

An additional \$206.1 million invested

- \$96.7 million in AOD services

Delivering against recommendations of the Royal Commission into Victoria's Mental Health System and a new Statewide Action Plan to address drug harms

Achievements in the past year

In the past year we have made significant progress towards transforming Victoria's mental health and wellbeing system:

- 15 Mental Health and Wellbeing Locals now open
- Three Children's Health and Wellbeing Locals opened
- Construction complete on 22 new mental health beds at RMH
- The new **Mental Health and Wellbeing Act** came into effect
- Eight new Mental Health and Wellbeing Connect centres opened
- Over 300 workforce scholarships delivered
- We launched the Take Home Naloxone Program

work is underway on more than 90% of recommendations from the Royal Commission

Harm Reduction Statewide Action Plan

The Budget includes funding to support the **\$95.1 million** Statewide Action Plan to address alcohol and other drug related harms across Victoria. Key initiatives within the plan include:

- A hydromorphone trial
- Expanding statewide access to pharmacotherapy
- Naloxone dispensing units
- Australian-first statewide Overdose Prevention and Response Helpline
- Wraparound services at the Salvation Army Centre at 69 Bourke Street
- Expanded street outreach services
- Appointment of Victoria's first Chief Addiction Medicine Adviser

\$36.4 million allocated in the Budget will establish a Community Health Hub in the CBD.

Eating disorders

An investment of \$25.6 million will make sure people with an eating disorder get the care they need.

Included in this investment is:

- \$6.4 million to deliver 10 dedicated early intervention professionals in the communities that need them most through Area Mental Health and Wellbeing Services
- \$6.9 million to establish a new Eating Disorders Day Program in regional Victoria
- \$6.5 million for two In-Home Intensive Early Engagement and Treatment Programs
- \$5.8 million to support the work of Eating Disorders Victoria

Suicide prevention

The State Budget commits \$3.8 million in 2024-25 to continue suicide prevention and response initiatives that support groups disproportionately impacted by suicide, including LGBTIQA+ people, young people and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. This includes:

Strong Brother Strong Sister suicide prevention and cultural mentoring program

Switchboard Victoria's LGBTIQA+ suicide prevention program

Youth Live4Life's mental health education and suicide prevention program

Roses in the Ocean's Peer CARE Companion Warmline

Mind Australia's LGBTIQA+ aftercare program

Yarning SafeNStrong, statewide helpline

Mental Health Workforce

- Over \$600 million has been invested since 2020-21 to support more than 2,500 new workers
- We have also supported 1,800 training positions through our mental health graduate program
- Funding of \$15.8 million in the 2024/25 Budget will support a graduate program in Local Services to further build a skilled workforce pipeline.



Additional investments

- \$6.4 million to continue Orygen's Moderated Online Social Therapy program
- \$16 million over three years to open 20 Youth Prevention and Recovery Care (YPARC) beds
- \$5.5 million to continue community-based supports through the Mental Health and Wellbeing Hubs
- \$2.8 million to continue statewide community mental health programs providing specialist support
- \$6.1 million supports delivery of a reformed mental health and wellbeing program
- \$1.4 million to continue delivery of the TelePROMPT service
