The Tasmanian online Driver Knowledge Test.


Applicants are required to answer 35 questions.

There are 170 questions in the pool. 19 of these are cycling related questions.

The test is broken into 4 sections. One of these sections is termed 'compulsory'. Applicants are required to answer 7 'compulsory' questions all of which must be answered correctly. Compulsory questions are drawn from a pool of 19 questions, one of which is a cycling related question.

The pool of questions changes from time to time depending on a range of reasons.
