

Election conduct inquiry launches survey for voters with disabilities

The Victorian Parliament's Electoral Matters Committee is inviting voters with disabilities to complete a [survey](#) as part of its inquiry into the conduct of the 2022 Victorian state election.

"We are looking at any improvements that need to be made to the way state elections are conducted in Victoria and we want to hear the experiences that people with disabilities had with voting at the most recent election," Committee Chair Luba Grigorovitch said.

"We are keen to know about any barriers that people with disabilities have faced participating in our electoral system, so that we can make recommendations to address those barriers," she said.

The [survey](#) can be completed online and there is also an easy English version and further information available on the survey webpage. It can be completed anonymously.

"We are grateful to Scope Australia for helping us develop the survey and the accompanying information," Ms Grigorovitch said.

"This survey is an important part of ensuring that all eligible Victorians can access voting in our state elections."

The survey is open until 18 December 2023.
