Final hearing into Victoria's state education system

The parliamentary inquiry into the state education system in Victoria will hold a seventh and final day of public hearings this week.

Association for Children with Disability, Disability Discrimination Legal Service, Code REaD Dyslexia Network, Dyslexia Victoria Support and Amaze are among the organisations to be represented in the morning sessions.

The Committee will also hear from school cleaners about the work they do in schools.

Australian Principals Federation (Victorian Branch), Victorian Association of State Secondary Principals, Grattan Institute, Parents Victoria, Brighton Primary School Council and the Australian Christian Lobby are scheduled throughout the afternoon.

“This is a very busy list of witnesses for our final day of hearings, reflecting the endeavour of our Committee to hear from as many groups and individuals as practical,” Acting Committee Chair Ryan Batchelor said.

“We initially held two days of public hearings in Gippsland, before moving to Bendigo, Shepparton and Melbourne. We are grateful for all of the evidence we have received.”
