



ABORIGINAL VICTORIANS

Over 50,000 Aboriginal people live in Victoria (Source: ABS estimate, 2014)

- By 2026 the Aboriginal population in Victoria is projected to rise to over 70,000
- Just over 50% of Aboriginal Victorians live in regional Victoria
- The median age is 22 years for Aboriginal Victorians, compared with 37 years for non-Aboriginal people



PROGRESS IN CLOSING THE GAP

The 2013 Victorian Government Aboriginal Affairs Report notes a number of improvements, including:

- perinatal mortality rate among babies born to Aboriginal mothers reached its lowest rate since 2004
- achievement of 100 per cent retention rate for Aboriginal students from years 7 to 10
- increased university enrolments by year 12 graduates
- increased number of Aboriginal students completing Certificate III or above in VET

There are also areas that require further attention, in particular:

- child protection substantiations
- smoking rates
- the over-representation of Aboriginal Victorians in the justice system



ABORIGINAL AFFAIRS 2014-15 BUDGET COMMITMENTS

The 2014-15 Budget will fund the following important initiatives:

- \$525,000 for the Victorian Aboriginal Economic Strategy
- \$3.1 million for the Victorian Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Strategy
- \$488,000 to support the Lake Tyers Aboriginal Trust's transition to self-governance
- \$80,000 to develop school curriculum material drawing on the Victorian Indigenous Honour Roll
