Delivery of the Early Years Strategic Plan

\$8.4 million in funding to provide additional support to young families and children

- \$4 million in workforce programs; and
- \$4.4 million for a suite of initiatives including:
 - a trial for the expansion of the current MCH Child Health Record
 - the Every Toddler Talking trial; and
 - funding work with local governments to improve centralised enrolments for MCH and kindergarten programs

Additional Funding

Children's Facilities Capital
Program
\$15 million

- Allow for targeted investment in areas experiencing existing or expected Kindergarten shortfalls
- Enable the upgrade or replacement of out-dated facilities







Targeted initiatives

\$1.2 million over two years for Early Childhood Intervention Services Improvement Project

Funding will support practice improvements to provide effective support for children with a disability or developmental delay

\$3.8 million over two years for Early Years Workforce Support

Funding will ensure children have access to a highquality early learning program.

\$2.1 million over three years for Maternal and Child Health Service Reform

Funding will help modernise the MCH service and improve support for vulnerable children

\$1.5 million over three years to improve support for vulnerable children

To streamline early childhood services for vulnerable children.







Achievements to Date

The Victorian Government has invested **\$283 million** since the 2011-12 Budget, including:

- Investment of more than **\$120 million** to build and upgrade hundreds of services across the state, including many in regional Victoria and growth corridors;
- \$43.6 million for 1,150 Early Childhood Intervention Service and 150 flexible support places to support children with disability or development delay from birth until school; and
- \$84.9 million in maternal and child health services to provide 10 Key Age and Stage checks free for all Victorian families with children from birth to school age.
