Invest in the design quality of environmental infrastructure. Quality is as important as quantity

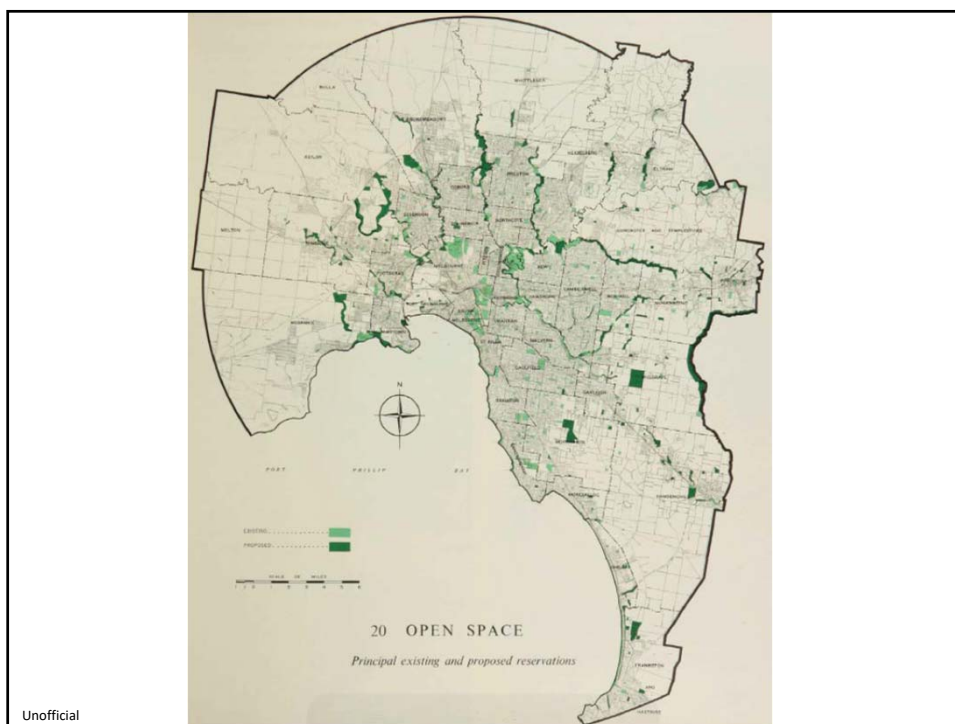
Be generous as well as equitable

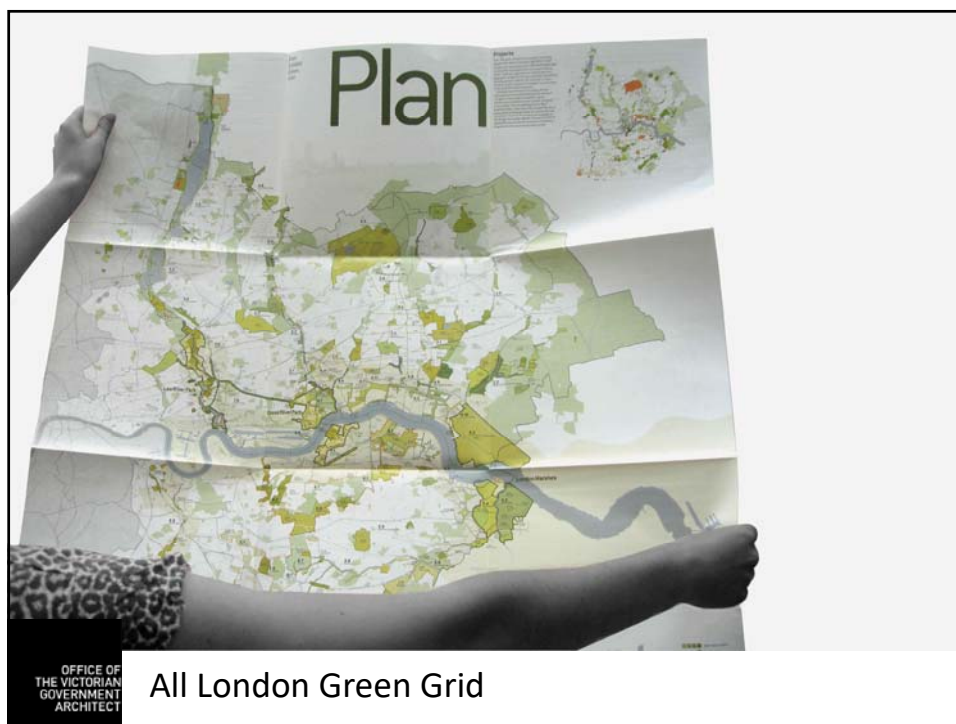
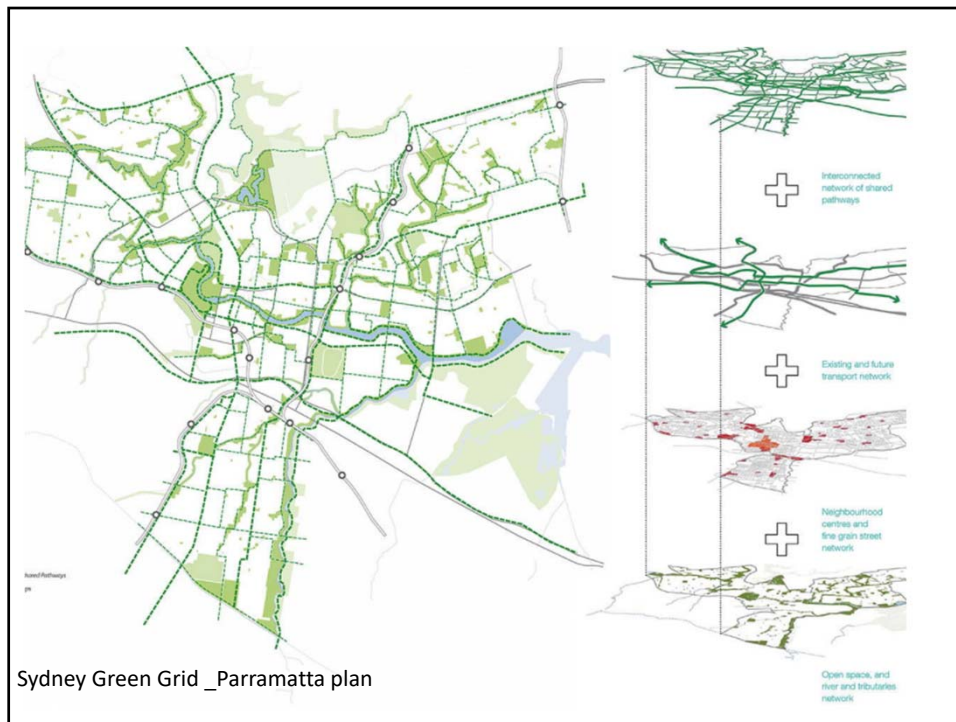
Be creative, drive innovation, and embrace wider contributions to environmental infrastructure outcomes

Create spaces that are unambiguously public and that invite use and engagement outcomes

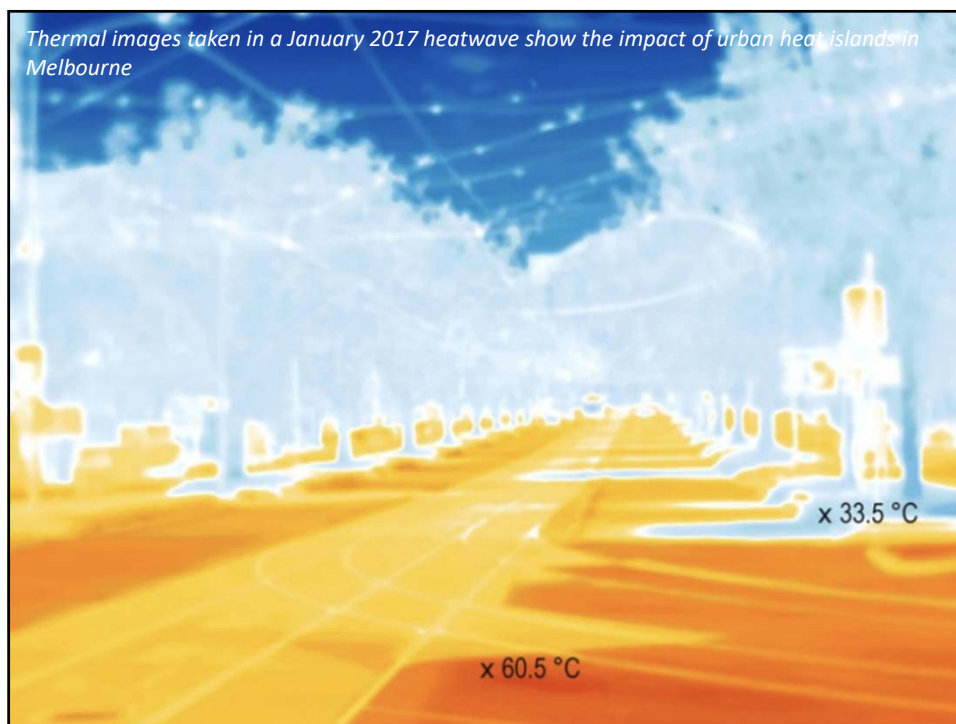
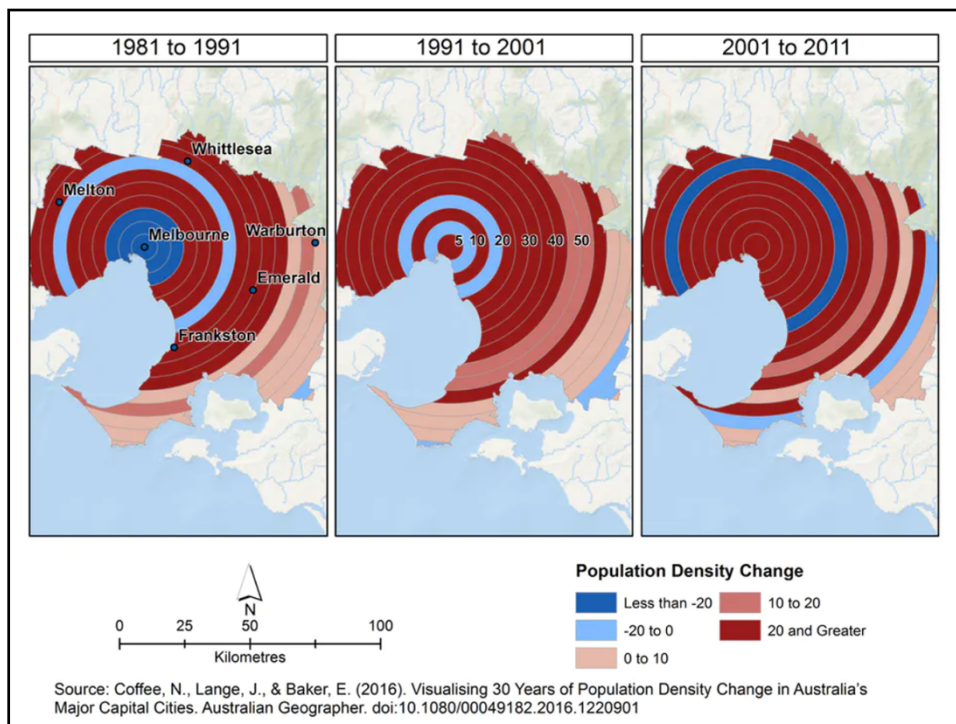
Continue a bold legacy – build on past plans and implement enduring places for the future.

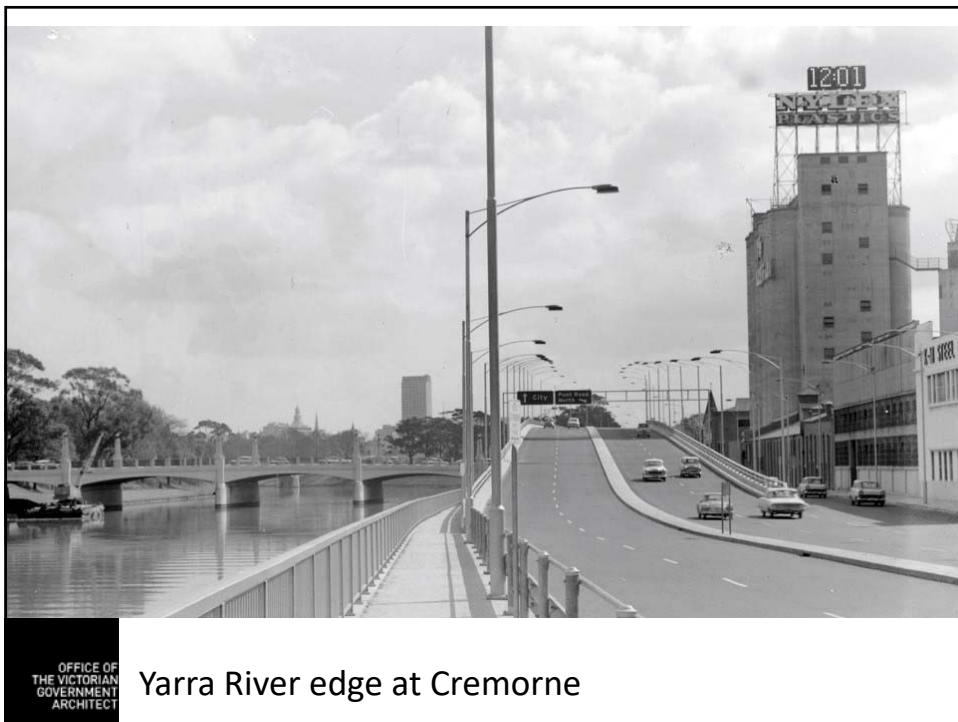
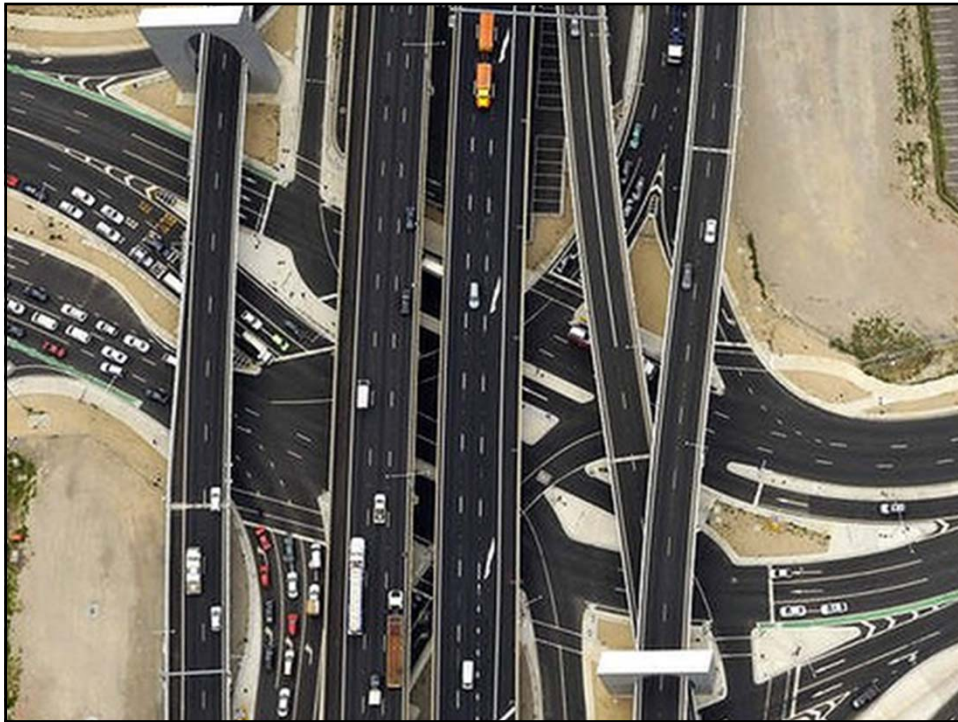
