Thailand Travel Report

Objective

This report provides an overview of work undertaken during a parliamentary delegation to Thailand in April 2023.

Key aims

The study trip's key aims included investigation of:

- Opportunities for bilateral trade and investment for regional businesses in our electorates, specifically including agricultural production and manufacturing, and food processing industries.
- Partnerships in education and healthcare, including discussion of opportunities to support education, employment and trade for Thai citizens and companies in Victoria.
- Wider workforce and immigration issues.
- Shared Health and Education issues and approaches.
- The policy approach of Thai authorities with respect to the possession of and use of cannabis. We are keen to understand why Thailand took this approach, and to learn from their experience and knowledge in this important area.

We are grateful to Consul Tessa Sullivan of the Royal Thai Consulate Melbourne, Tirta Rojrangsee at the Royal Thai Embassy Canberra, and Siwit (Jack) Techatawiekul of the Australian-Thai Chamber of Commerce, for arrangement of the delegation's itinerary.

Conclusions

The discussions identified opportunities for bilateral trade and investment, and highlighted a number of educational and training opportunities which we intend to explore. They also demonstrated current difficulties arising from workforce and immigration issues.

Throughout, we saw a significant opportunity on both sides. Provided the obstacles discussed can be lessened or overcome, there is great potential for mutual investment and operation, with Australian companies setting up or expanding in Thailand, and Thai companies doing likewise in Victoria.

The sectors in which this reciprocal expansion were most likely appear to be health, education, agriculture, hospitality and advanced manufacturing.

A particular focus of certain meetings was on healthcare, and it was helpful to learn of the Thai experience in this important sector. Likewise, there are lessons both positive and negative to be learnt from the partial decriminalization of the recreational and medicinal cannabis industry in Thailand, a matter we were keen to discuss given the current Victorian political landscape.

Our delegation achieved the outcomes sought, forging links with Thai businesses, officials and government representatives, as well as with Australian individuals, companies and organisations operating in Thailand.

We return with a broader understanding of the aspects detailed in the report, and would give particular weight to the following texts, which were recommended and discussed at different points in the meetings referred to in this Report.
