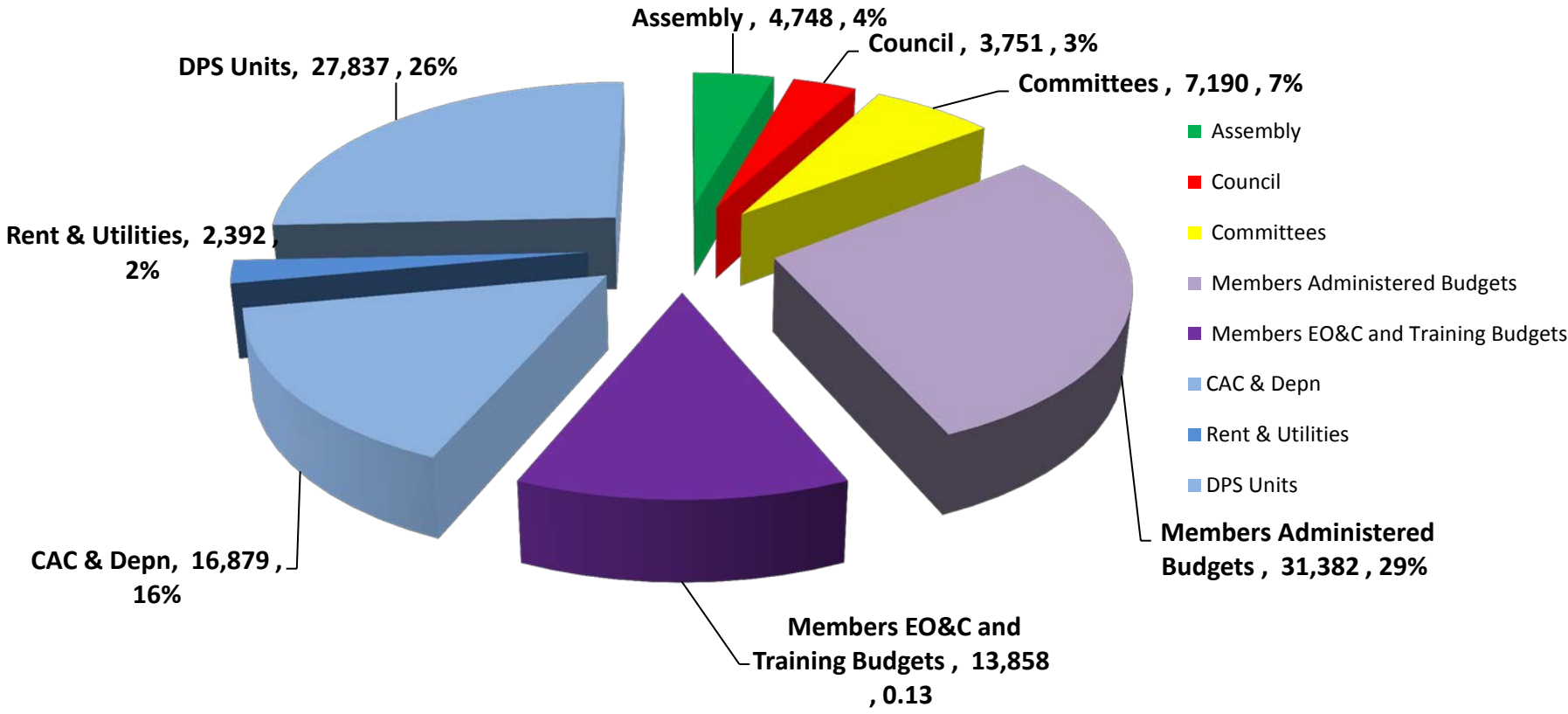

Appropriation changes from 2015-16

- 2016-17 (Published Appropriation Bill) includes
 - Reversal of GED savings \$3.1m
 - Council Committees – \$0.405m
 - Improve Staff Safety at Electorate Offices (provide leave backup) \$1.739m
 - Performance Audit of VAGO \$0.380m
 - MP EO&C budget changes due to voter count increase \$0.153m
 - Capital \$28.714m from Parliament's prior year surplus



Key Achievements for 2015-16



Legislative Council – unfunded Standing Committee achievements as at end March 2016

- 3 committees
- 12 inquiries
- 8 reports tabled
- 3958 submissions
- 69 public hearings
- Secretariat support of 8.5 staff
- **Total expenditure \$792,545 (end of March)**



Legislative Council – unfunded Select Committee achievements as at end March 2016

Port of Melbourne Select Committee

- \$5-7 billion estimated value of Bill
- 87 Submissions received
- 58 public hearings
- Commenced September 2015 and reported December 2015
- **Total cost of inquiry \$147,000**



Joint Investigatory Committees achievements as at end March 2016

- 9 committees
- 20 inquiries
- 39 reports (including 22 SARC Alert Digests)
- 1056 submissions
- 277 public hearings
- 31.2 Secretariat staff support
- **Total expenditure \$4.56 million** (end of March)
- Total year budget \$6.5 million

Key Activities 2015-16

- Capacity building activities undertaken in Fiji, Nauru and Tuvalu through Pacific Partnership Program
- Enhanced the security of Parliament's IT network by deploying an improved firewall to intercept potential threats over the internet
- Implemented Hansard Chamber Automation system improving the quality and reliability of chamber broadcast
- Modernised Parliamentary email system by migrating from IBM Lotus Domino/Notes to Microsoft Exchange/Outlook for email and calendar
- Installed new audio system in Queens Hall increasing the quality of audio available to support meetings, seminars and public events
- Implemented video conferencing capability at 55 SAP supporting increased attendee flexibility for Committees and other meetings



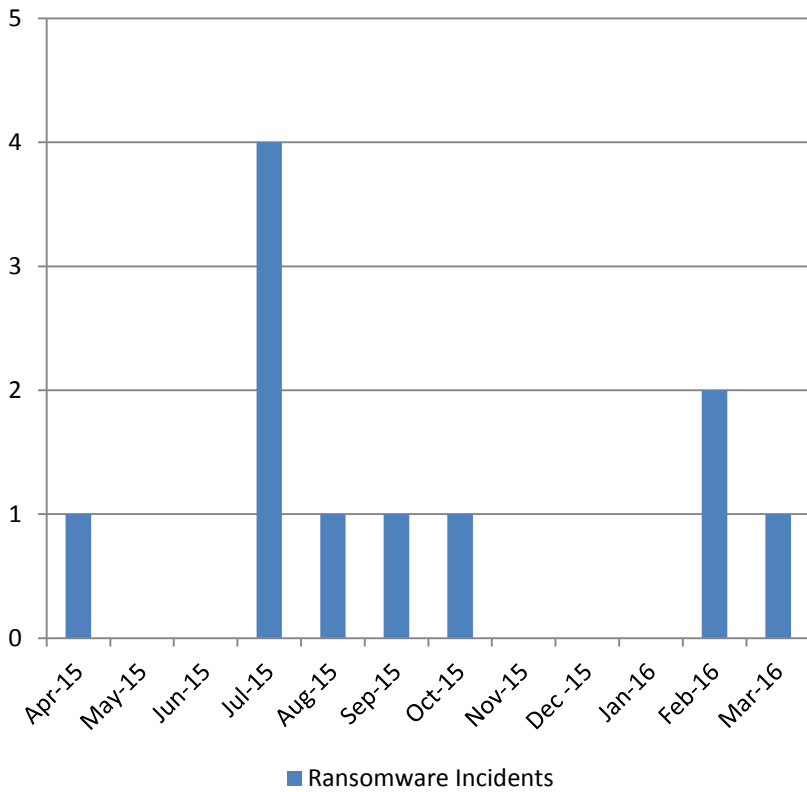
Service Delivery Improvements in 2015-16

- Continued professional development for MPs on parliamentary procedure
- Hardware refresh of multi function devices and desktop printers for Electorate Offices
- Wi-Fi improvements for electorate offices
- Completed backup network links for all electorate offices to reduce frequency and length of network interruptions
- Upgrade of Library Database software
- New radio communications network for Parliament security and fire safety
- Completed relocation of MPs affected by electoral boundary redistribution
- Digitisation of Historical Parliamentary Papers, Hansard, Bills, Explanatory Memoranda , News clippings (900,000+), and parliamentary heritage material.
- On-board project to introduce electronic administration for new staff

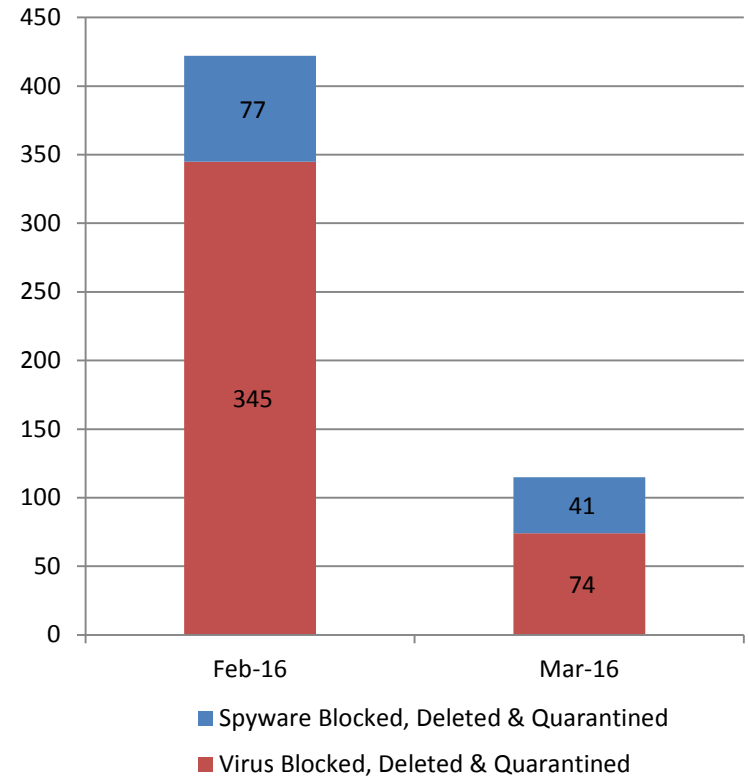


IT Security Data and Trends

Ransomware Incidents



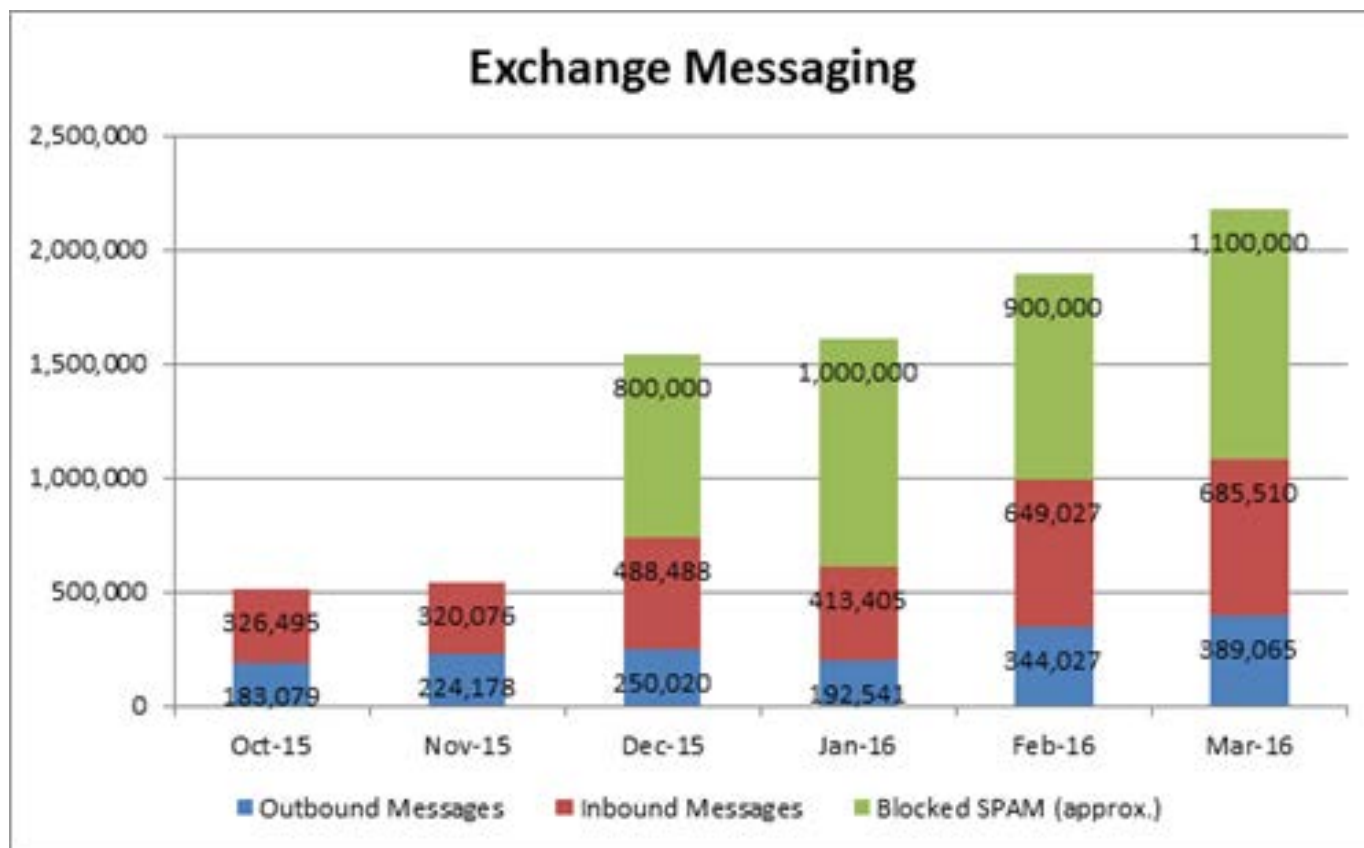
Viruses stopped

On average about 75% of all incoming emails are detected as SPAM or malware and automatically deleted.





Budget pressures 2016-17

Increase in costs at a rate higher than the escalation provided in budget (2.5%):

- Electorate Office rentals (avg increase 4.8%)
- Precinct rental (avg increase 7.6%)
- Electorate Officer EBA (avg increase 3%)
- IT licences and data communication costs (avg increase 3.2%)
- Parliamentary Officer EBA (avg increase 3.25%)
- Unknown IT and physical security costs (in response to heightened security threats)



Key Strategic Priorities for 2016-17

Remediation - Office Accommodation in the Parliamentary Precinct



Temporary accommodation

- To be demolished 6/4/16 to 13/4/16
- built in the 1970s with an intended lifespan of five years
- deteriorated significantly – Standard of accommodation no longer suitable for members of Parliament
- significant OH&S risk - high level of asbestos used in its construction



Planned Accommodation

- To be completed by Dec 2017
- purpose built accommodation facility for 102 MPs





Remediation - Office Accommodation in the Parliamentary Precinct



Benefits

- Improved standard of accommodation for stakeholders
- Improved building operating performance and efficiency
- Improved security
- Reduced risk of injury and liability
- Preservation of Parliament House as a heritage asset to continue in its core function as the seat of Parliament



Priorities for 2016-17

Improve physical security

- Undertake projects to improve public private separation & visitor management in the Parliamentary precinct
- Review electorate office security arrangements
- Develop and deliver a security awareness program targeted to electorate officers

Improve staff safety at Electorate Offices

- Provision for additional staffing to reduce risks of staff working alone

Improvements to IT

- Implement new IT strategy with a focus on mobility
- Improve IT security and manage threats
