2. Please provide further details on the five precincts in the Melbourne Remand Centre as requested in p.11 of the hearing transcript.

(Page 11 of the Corrections portfolio transcript)

The Metropolitan Remand Centre has five main accommodation precincts as well as a management area. The different precincts include:

- reception/orientation – for prisoners who are new to the prison system or the Metropolitan Remand Centre
- restricted regime – an area which has modified out of cell hours for prisoners who may have demonstrated difficulty in adjusting to the prison's requirements
- mainstream – for the majority of prisoners
- protection – for prisoners who require a separate placement from mainstream prisoners due to safety concerns
- incentive regime – for prisoners who are provided with a range of incentives (for example, additional visits or cottage style accommodation) for demonstrating sustained good behaviour in the prison.
