# Inquiry calls for young adults to share views on cannabis

A parliamentary inquiry examining the use of cannabis in Victoria is giving young adults a unique opportunity to share their views.

The Legislative Council Legal and Social Issues Committee is holding a forum to workshop ideas on Monday 28 June at Parliament House in Melbourne.

People aged 18 to 25 will have the chance to discuss matters relating to the use of cannabis with Members of the Committee.

“We know young adults are the biggest users of cannabis which is why it is important to hear their opinions,” Committee Chair Fiona Patten said.

“This will give us the chance to hear directly from them about whether current cannabis laws are working well and how we can improve education and deliver better services.

“Our aim is to collect a range of views and table it as supplementary evidence to help inform our final report.”
