Oaths And Affirmations

- After establishing the identity of the witness, ask him/her to stand in the witness box.
- It is often helpful to point them in the right direction!!
- Make sure the witness does not walk between the Bench and the Bar table.
- Unless the Magistrate has given permission, the witness must stand whilst taking the oath.
- Make sure there is silence in the courtroom and if anyone is moving about ask them to remain stationary.

OATH

Ask the witness to:

RAISE THE BIBLE AND REPEAT AFTER ME

(pausing after each line to allow the witness to repeat it.

"I SWEAR BY ALMIGHTY GOD

THAT THE EVIDENCE I SHALL GIVE

TO THE COURT IN THIS CASE (APPLICATION)

SHALL BE THE TRUTH

THE WHOLE TRUTH

AND NOTHING BUT THE TRUTH."

Then ask the witness to replace the Bible (and if it is the practice at your court, to be seated.)

If the witness is unrepresented and not appearing for the prosecution ask him/her to:

"STATE YOUR FULL NAME ADDRESS AND OCCUPATION."

AFFIRMATION

- Any person who objects to swearing on the Bible or similar, takes an affirmation.
- Ascertain the witness' full name and ask him/her to repeat after you

"I (full name) DO SOLEMNLY, SINCERELY AND TRULY

DECLARE AND AFFIRM

THAT THE EVIDENCE I SHALL GIVE

TO THE COURT IN THIS CASE

SHALL BE THE TRUTH

THE WHOLE TRUTH

AND NOTHING BUT THE TRUTH"

INTERPRETERS OATH

- The interpreter is sworn in before the witness.
- Often the interpreter knows the oath, you should ascertain this before he/she enters the witness box. most Magistrates allow Interpreters to swear themselves in.

"I SWEAR BY ALMIGHTY GOD THAT I SHALL WELL AND TRULY INTERPRET

THE EVIDENCE ABOUT TO BE GIVEN

AND ALL OTHER MATTERS AND THINGS

THAT MAY BE REQUIRED OF ME IN THIS CASE

TO THE BEST OF MY SKILL AND ABILITY."

Then ask the Interpreter to state his full name address and occupation.

INTERPRETERS AFFIRMATION

"I (full name) DO SOLEMNLY, SINCERLEY AND TRULY DECLARE AND AFFIRM.

THAT I SHALL WELL AND TRULY INTERPRET

THE EVIDENCE ABOUT TO BE GIVEN

AND ALL OTHER MATTERS AND THING THAT MAY BE REQUIRED OF ME IN THIS CASE

TO THE BEST OF MY SKILL AND ABILITY"

Then ask the Interpreter to state his full name, address and occupation.

NOTES OF INTEREST

- Practising Jews will usually take an Oath on the Old Testament only.
- Muslims take an Oath on the Koran, this should be wrapped in a black cloth. DO NOT REMOVE THE CLOTH as the Koran cannot be seen by Infidels (nonbelievers)
