Dear Mrs Brent,

I thank you for sending the discussion paper on vescations litigants and I must declare I have had a limited education with no honours, degrees or titles except for war service medals for R.A.F. duties and a gold card, with life experiences most people will ever endure. There are numerous rights including right to life, civil rights, right of way on the roads, more important are civil rights.

We must all agree there comes a time when these rights must give way to the justice systems which is the backbone of our society, without that we have anarchy.

I believe if a person has been judged by a court of law or a tribunal that decision should be final.

The right to appeal could be granted only once and the decision should end the case.

If the litigant persists in further annoying and troublesome actions the vescations litigant act should apply and declared by the Govt. Judicial Committee.

I have only the reports of three vescations litigants two are male criminals and one female who have cost the public

many thousands of dollars in legal fees and many hours of valuable court times

With only fourteen visitations litigants declared in eighty years by supreme courts

I suggest that all courts who are hands on with the cases should have the power to declare a visitations litigant, if mental impairment is the problem a litigant should be directed to have the appropriate treatment at their own expense.

There should be training for all court officials in the identification of visitations litigants and the actions necessary to have them listed in all jurisdictions in Australia to prevent their destructive and annoying activities arising in their legal zones.

The problem must be attended to because there are too many citizens who climb onto other peoples shoulders all their lives and make excessive demands on our public monies which should be channelled into essential services. I wish you all good luck with your deliberations.
