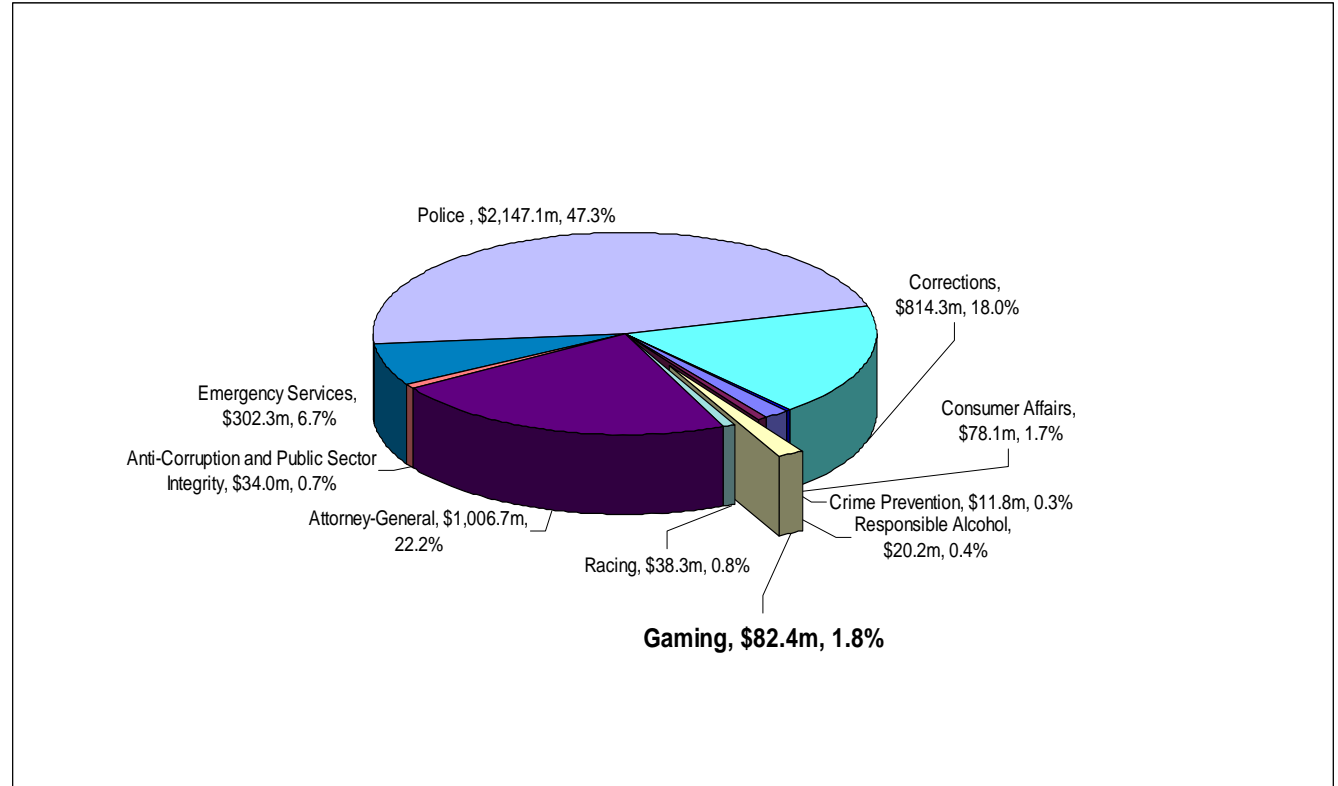

Our key priorities

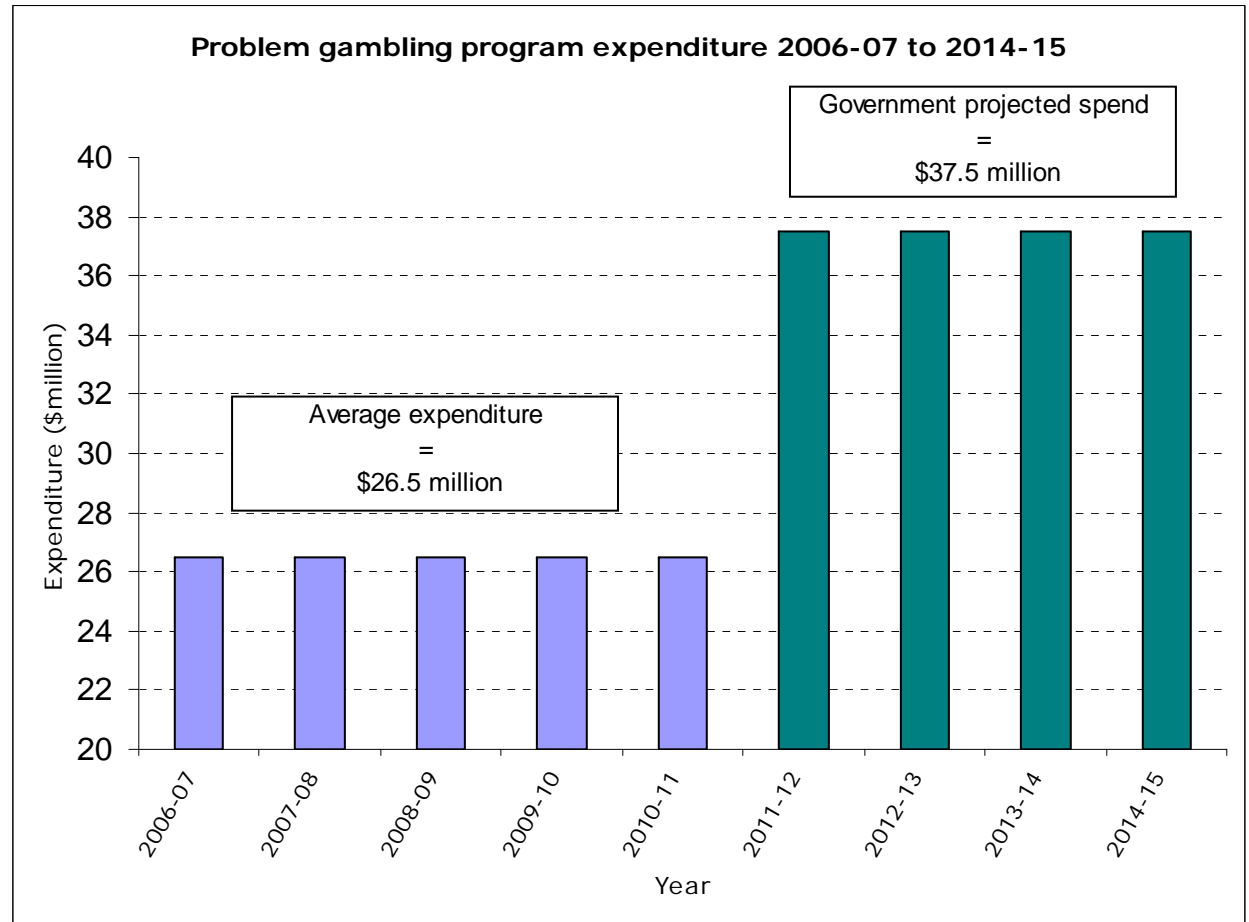
- Tackling problem gambling

- Transitioning to the new gambling industry arrangements



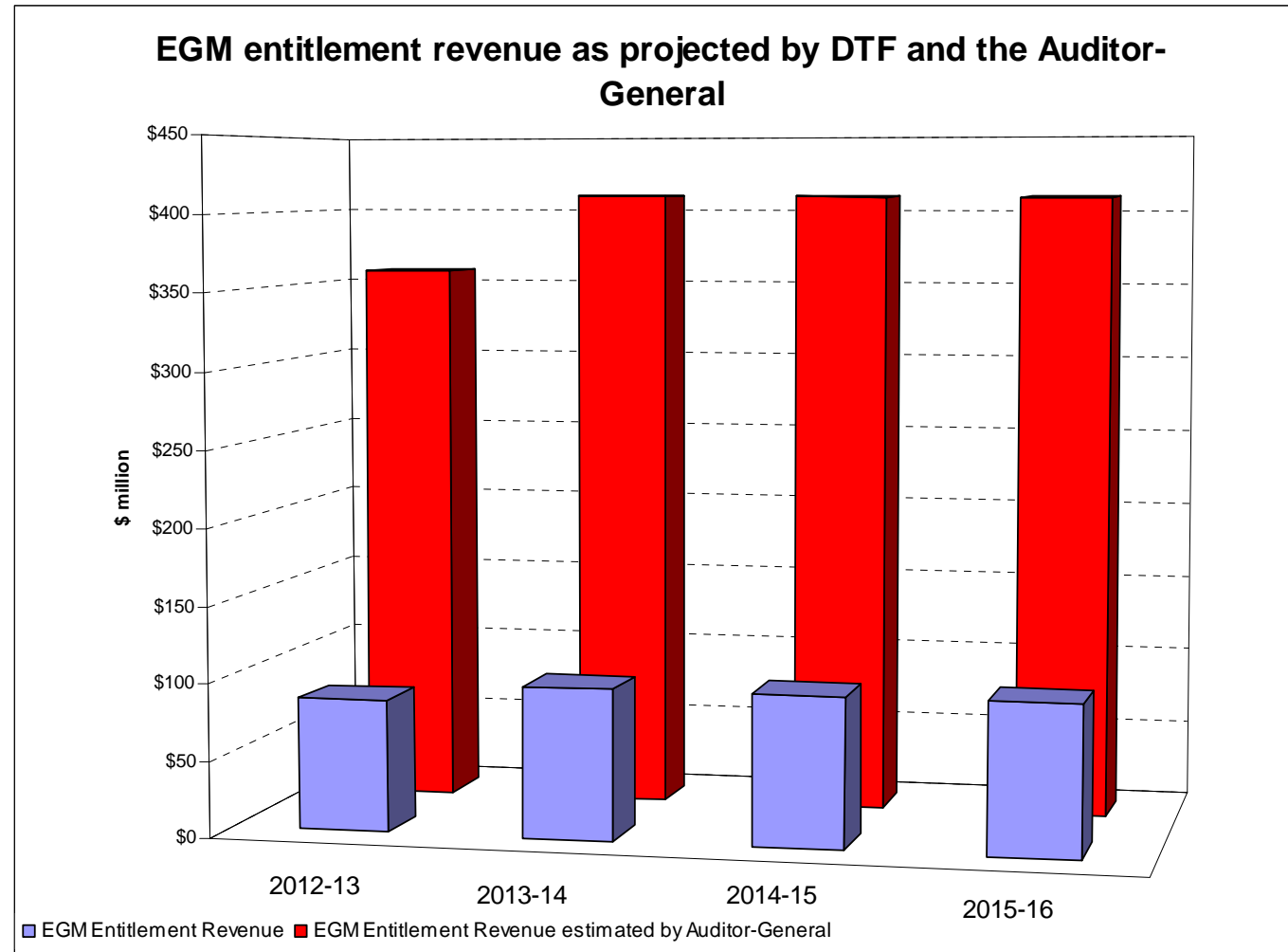
Minimising gambling-related harm

- Progressed implementation of voluntary pre-commitment
- Moved to prevent circumvention of the ban on ATMs in gaming venues
- Issued interim ban on earphones on gaming machines
- Issued a new order banning moneyless gaming machines
- Prescribed new 'plain' signage for gaming venues

Budget Impact – EGM Licence Auction Revenue



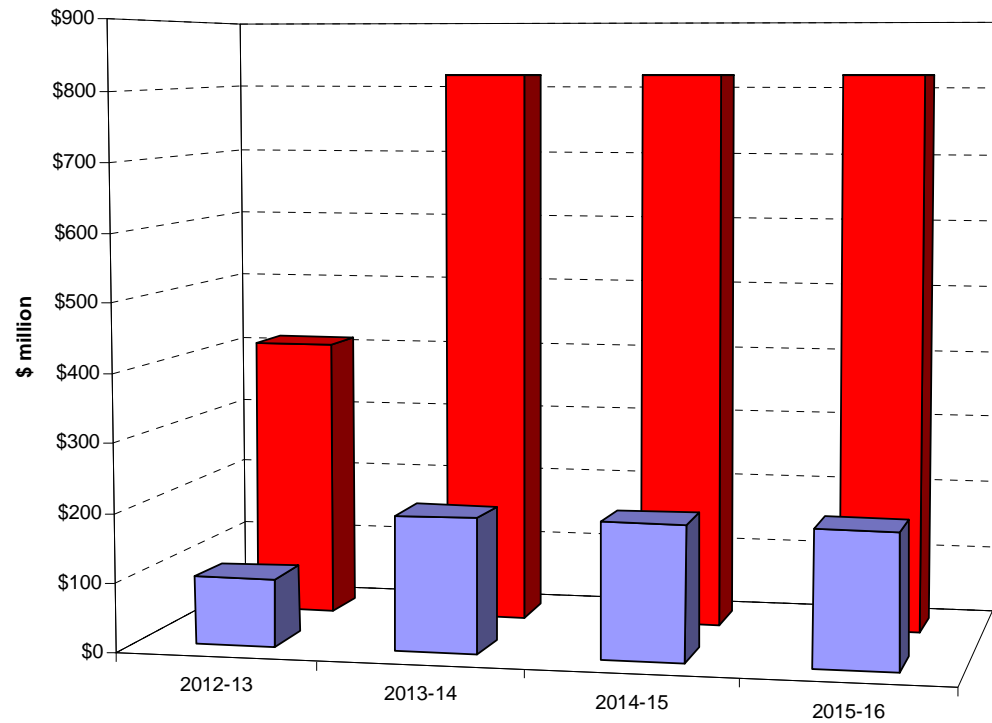

A new era in the fight against problem gambling

Victorian Responsible Gambling Foundation

- \$150 million over four years
- The largest commitment to combat problem gambling in Victoria's history
- Providing an integrated approach to problem gambling research, communication, education, treatment and counselling



A new era in gambling and liquor regulation

Victorian Commission for Gambling and Liquor Regulation

- Commenced on 6 February 2012
- Located in Richmond
- A new entity with commission-style decision making
- A modern, capable, best practice regulator focussing on community well being, harm minimisation and fair and honest industries



A new era in gambling licensing

Transitioning to the new industry arrangements

- New Keno licence commenced on 15 April 2012
- Wagering and betting licence awarded on 19 July 2011 to commence on 16 August 2012
- Monitoring licence awarded on 14 September 2011 to commence on 16 August 2012
