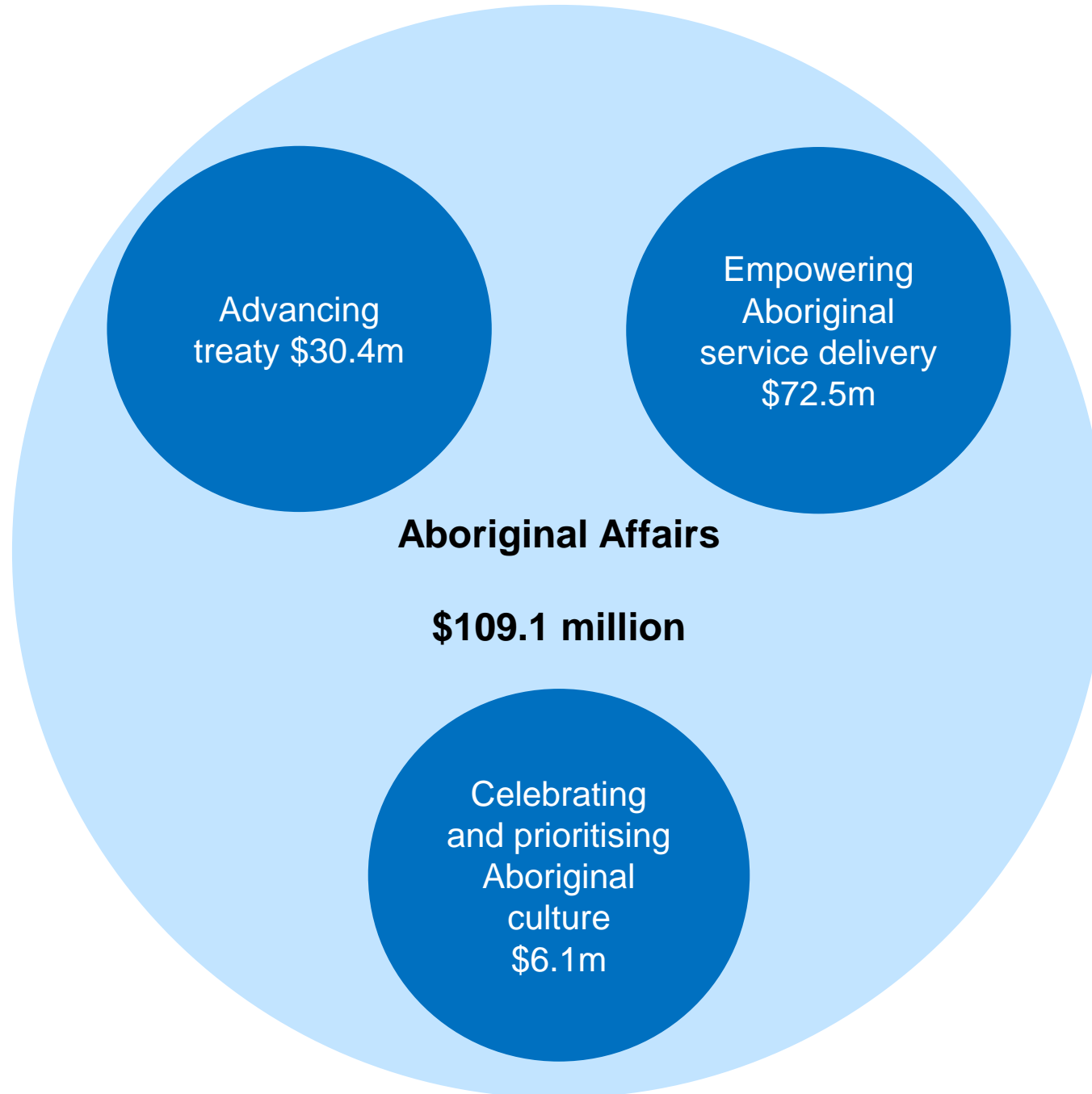

Advancing treaty

\$30.4 million over two years to continue to advance Victoria's historic treaty process, including:

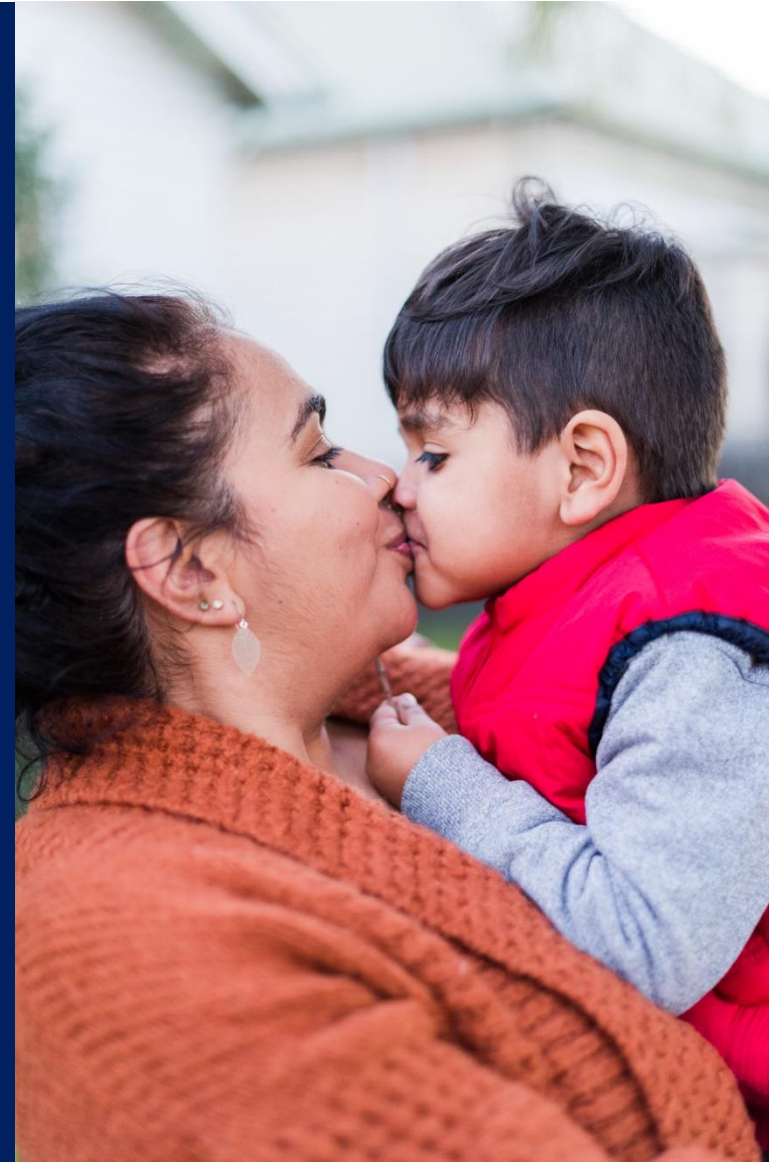
- funding the operations of the Aboriginal Representative Body
- supporting Traditional Owner treaty readiness
- establishing a specialist State treaty team.



Empowering Aboriginal service delivery

\$72.5 million to empower Aboriginal-led services across a number of areas, including:

- \$28.8 million to continue to implement the Aboriginal 10 Year Family Violence Agreement 2018-2028
- \$13.6 million to continue the transfer of case management of Aboriginal children in care to Aboriginal Community Controlled Organisations
- \$8.7 million to implement an Aboriginal specific sexual assault support service
- \$8.5 million to continue successful Aboriginal mental health demonstration projects
- \$2.4 million for the Koori Women's Place
- \$10.1 million strengthen Aboriginal children's connection with family, culture and community through a new model of kinship care
- \$0.4 million to support Aboriginal organisations to deliver targeted youth mentoring programs which support and empower Aboriginal young people.



Celebrating and prioritising Aboriginal culture

\$6.1 million to celebrate and prioritise Aboriginal culture in Victoria, including:

- developing the Budj Bim Master Plan
- training Aboriginal language teachers
- implementing the Hanging Rock Strategic Plan.
