Attorney-General: Coroners Court — Victorian Systemic Review of Family Violence Deaths

8391. MS HARTLAND — To ask the Honourable the Attorney-General: In relation to the Coroners Court’s systemic review into deaths relating to family violence, will \$250 000 in additional annual funding be provided to the Coroners Court in order for the Victorian Systemic Review of Family Violence Deaths to continue its work; if so, when will this funding recommence.

ANSWER:

As I have previously indicated, the Victorian Systemic Review of Family Violence Deaths was established as a review to be undertaken in the coroners prevention unit of the Coroner’s Court, in order to examine the systemic causes of family violence deaths in Victoria.

The question is misconceived, because separate funding for the systemic review of family violence deaths ceased under the former Labor government in 2010. Since that time the work on the review has been undertaken by the coroners prevention unit under the unit’s overall budget.

As I have also previously indicated, the government supports this work of the Coroners Court and is continuing to work with the court on arrangements to ensure the review continues.

Premier: tolls — South Eastern Metropolitan Region

8576. MR TARLAMIS — To ask the Minister for Health (for the Premier): Given that the Premier ruled out tolling existing road projects in his interview with an ABC 774 program, will the Premier give an unequivocal guarantee that:

- (a) all other road projects under construction and consideration in the South Eastern Metropolitan Region will operate without tolls; and
- (b) he has not sought research on the projected revenue of tolling any roads in the South Eastern Metropolitan Region.

ANSWER:

Introducing new tolls on existing roads is not something that the Victorian Coalition Government is currently considering and I have not sought research on the projected revenue of tolling any existing roads in the South Eastern Metropolitan Region.

As part of the solution for funding new road projects the Victorian Government has not ruled out tolls. If tolls are introduced for such new roads projects in the future the Government will communicate this clearly to the Victorian public.

Public transport: rail — Sydenham and Werribee lines

8723. MS HARTLAND — To ask the Minister for Planning (for the Minister for Public Transport): In relation to trains expressing past scheduled stations in order to catch up time, over the period 1 July to 30 September 2012, how many trains were scheduled to stop at all stations but bypassed one or more stations on the —

- (a) Sydenham Line; and
- (b) Werribee Line.

ANSWER:

I am informed that, as at the date the question was raised:

Metro advise that unplanned express running occurs only where it is necessary to reduce further delays to other timetabled trains. For the time period specified, less than 0.1 per cent of trains bypassed one or more railway stations on the Sydenham and Werribee lines.

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Thursday, 15 November 2012

Assistant Treasurer: surplus land — Benalla

- 8551. MS BROAD** — To ask the Assistant Treasurer: In relation to land in Wedge Street, between Arundel and Goomalibee streets, Benalla:
- (1) Has any land been considered, or will be considered for sale to Benalla Catholic Education, St Joseph's Primary School, Benalla, Faithful Companions of Jesus College, Benalla, or any other interests.
 - (2) Has any land been declared, or will be declared as surplus to Victorian Government requirements; if so, has any land been offered to Local Government or Victorian Government entities for community purposes or any other purposes.
 - (3) Has any land been valued by the Valuer-General Victoria for any purpose.

ANSWER:

I am informed that:

In relation to land in Wedge Street, between Arundel and Goomalibee Streets, Benalla my reply is limited to the former Department of Education and Early Childhood Development (DEECD) Hume Regional Office located at 46–52 Arundel Street, Benalla.

- (1) St Joseph's Primary School, Benalla has been given first right of refusal to purchase the property in order to satisfy a prior DEECD commitment. In the event that negotiations fail the property will be put to the public market.
- (2) DEECD declared the property surplus to requirements and on 12 December 2011 requested the Department of Treasury and Finance facilitate its disposal. The Benalla Rural City Council advised no interest in acquiring this property on 4 November 2010. No other Victorian Government entity has expressed interest in the property.
- (3) Negotiations continue with the Roman Catholic Trusts Corporation for the Diocese of Sandhurst, on behalf of St Joseph's Primary School, Benalla, based on current market valuation advice provided by the Valuer-General Victoria.

Roads: Healesville freeway reservation

8715. MR LEANE — To ask the Minister for Planning (for the Minister for Roads): What are the intentions for the land designated for the Healesville bypass road in the following postcodes:

- (a) Croydon, 3136;
- (b) Bayswater, 3153;

- (c) Kilsyth, 3137;
- (d) Mooroolbark, 3138;
- (e) Wantirna, 3152;
- (f) Vermont, 3133; and
- (g) Forest Hill, 3131.

ANSWER:

I am informed that, as at the date the question was raised:

VicRoads has determined that the section of the Healesville Freeway Reservation between Springvale Road and Boronia Road is no longer required for road purposes. This section of the reservation is within the suburbs of Forest Hill and Vermont. VicRoads is currently undertaking community consultation to determine the best use of this land.

VicRoads continues to protect the remainder of the reservation between Boronia Road and Mooroolbark Road. This section of the reservation is within the suburbs of Wantirna, Bayswater, Croydon, Kilsyth and Mooroolbark.
