THE ROYAL ASSENT TO AN ACT SHORTLY ENTITLED
THE CONSTITUTION ACT 1975.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Common-
wealth of Australia, in accordance with the provisions of
section 60 of the *Constitution Act Amendment Act 1958*,
do by this my Proclamation signify that the Bill the title
whereof is herein set forth, that is to say—

“An Act to re-enact the Law relating to the
Constitution of the State of Victoria and for other
purposes.”

which was reserved pursuant to the provisions of the
Australian States Constitution Act 1907 (7 Edw. 7 c. 7)
for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, has
been laid before Her Majesty in Council and that by an
Order in Council bearing date the twenty-second day of
October, 1975, Her Majesty has been pleased to assent
to same.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of
Victoria, this eighteenth day of November, in the
year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and
seventy-five and in the twenty-fourth year of the
reign of Her Majesty Elizabeth the Second, Queen
of Australia.
