

And the said amendments were read a second time and, after debate, agreed to by the House.

Ordered—That the Bill be returned to the Legislative Council with a Message acquainting them that the Legislative Assembly have agreed to the said amendments.

20. LIQUOR CONTROL (AMENDMENT) BILL.—The Order of the Day for the consideration of the amendments made by the Legislative Council in this Bill having been read, the said amendments were read and are as follows :—

1. Clause 6, paragraph (b), lines 29–33, omit this paragraph.
2. Clause 9, line 18, after “ litres ” insert “ in the case of liquor which includes beer ale or porter and 9 litres in any other case ”.
3. Clause 11, omit this clause.
4. Clause 19, sub-clause (5), page 8, line 15, at the end of the sub-clause insert—

‘ (7) For the purposes of this section “ register of members ” includes a system of record in a form prescribed to be a register of members for the purposes of this section or approved of by the Commission either generally or in any particular case.’

And the said amendments were read a second time and, after debate, agreed to by the House.

Ordered—That the Bill be returned to the Legislative Council with a Message acquainting them that the Legislative Assembly have agreed to the said amendments.

21. MESSAGE FROM THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.—Agreeing to the Constitution Bill with amendments.

And the said amendments were read and are as follows :—

1. Clause 40, line 24, at the end of the clause insert the following sub-clause :—

“ (3) The Chairman of Committees shall be the Deputy Speaker of the Assembly.”

2. Clause 44, sub-clause (3), omit this sub-clause and insert—

“ () An elector who has been convicted or found guilty of a felony committed by him when of or over the age of 18 years under the law of Victoria or under the law of any other part of the British Commonwealth of Nations shall not be qualified to be elected a member of the Council or the Assembly.”

And the said amendments were read a second time and, after debate, agreed to by the House.

Ordered—That the Bill be returned to the Legislative Council with a Message acquainting them that the Legislative Assembly have agreed to the said amendments.

22. MESSAGES FROM THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.—Agreeing to the following Bills without amendment :—

24. POSTPONEMENT OF ORDERS OF THE DAY.—Ordered—That the consideration of the remaining Orders of the Day be postponed.

25. ADJOURNMENT.—Resolved, after debate—That the House do now adjourn.
