10. ADOPTION OF NEW STANDING ORDERS—APPROVAL OF HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR.—Mr. Speaker announced the receipt of a communication from the Clerk reporting that the consolidated and revised Standing Orders, adopted by the Legislative Assembly on the 7th May last had, on the 16th May last, been laid before His Excellency the Governor for his approval and that His Excellency was pleased to approve of the same.
11. MINES (AMENDMENT) BILL.—Mr. Balfour, by leave, obtained leave, with Mr. Borthwick, to bring in a Bill intituled “ *A Bill to amend the ‘ Mines Act 1958 ’* ” ; and the said Bill was read a first time, ordered to be printed and, by leave, read a second time this day.
