NOTICE OF MOTION :

Mr O'SHANASSY : To move, that an Address be presented to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that His Excellency will cause to be laid before this Council—

1. Return of the quantity of land alienated from the Crown from 30th June, 1851, to 1st July, 1852, specifying the number of acres, the average price per acre, the gross proceeds in town, suburban, and country.

2. Return showing the amount realised at public auction and by private sale in town, suburban, and country, from 30th June, 1851, to 1st July, 1852, giving the gross proceeds of the same in each town, suburb, and country, in the Colony, for the same period.

3. Return of lands alienated under the pre-emptive right from 30th June, 1851, to 1st July, 1852, date of application, name of applicant, number of acres applied for, local description, names of valuers, estimated value of improvements, if any, valuation per acre, irrespective of improvements, and number of acres alienated.

4. Return of Lands applied for under the Pre-emptive Right, from 30th June, 1851, to 1st July, 1852, date of application, name of applicant, number of acres applied for, local description, cause of delay.

5. Return of Lands applied for, under the Pre-emptive Right from 30th June, 1851, to the 1st July, 1852, but refused, date of application, name of applicant, number of acres applied for, local description, cause of refusal.

6. Return of Lands applied for under the Pre-emptive Right, and valued, but refused by the applicant; date of application, name of applicant, number of acres applied for, local description, names of valuers, estimated value of improvements, valuation per acre, irrespective of improvements.

7. Return under the heads of Town, Suburban, and Country; with the names of each and local situation of the quantities of waste lands of the Crown in the Colony of Victoria, surveyed but not alienated, and what impediments exist to prevent their sale, if applied for by the public.

8. Return of the number of Agricultural or other Reserves made throughout the Colony of Victoria, with local description as to extent and situation—the quantity of each reserve already alienated, and shewing the amount realised from the same in each Reserve, under the head of Town, Suburban, and Country.

9. Return under the foregoing heads, quarterly;—commencing on 1st July, 1852, to illustrate the progress of the sale and settlement of the Crown Lands in the Colony of Victoria.
