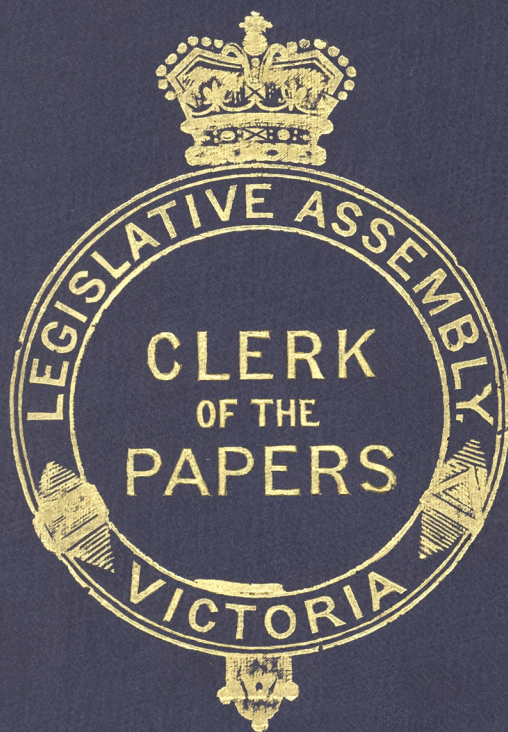

Questions.

1. MR. HUGHES: To ask the Honorable the Attorney-General—

1. When was William Henry Lavery, who was sentenced at Ballarat Supreme Court on 22nd May, 1925, by Judge Winneke to two months' imprisonment on each of three counts for common assault—sentences to be concurrent, and to four months' imprisonment on each of two counts for assault occasioning actual bodily harm—sentences to be concurrent, or to a period of imprisonment for six months, discharged from the Geelong Gaol.
2. By whose order was he so discharged, and why.

2. MR. PRENDERGAST: To ask the Honorable the Minister of Public Health if he will lay on the table of the Library the report of the Pure Milk Committee on compulsory brine cooling.

3. MR. HUGHES: To ask the Honorable the Chief Secretary if he will lay on the table of the Library—

1. The whole of the files relating to—(a) the transfer of Senior Constables Paige and Harnetty from Ballarat; and (b) the proposed transfer of Senior Detective Morgan and Plainclothes Constable Brown from Ballarat.
2. All the reports submitted by Superintendent Hood to Chief Commissioner Nicholson concerning these policemen.

4. MR. LEMMON: To ask the Honorable the Minister of Railways if he will lay on the table of the Library the files relating to the importation of trucks, locomotives, and brake appliances for the Railway Department.

5. MR. TUNNECLIFFE: To ask the Honorable the Chief Secretary if motor cars other than those owned by the Police Branch have been repaired at Russell-street Police Barracks by the police mechanic in his police-duty hours.

6. MR. CLOUGH: To ask the Honorable the Attorney-General if the Government has given consideration to the report of Mr. Kelley, the Royal Commissioner on Bendigo Sewerage Authority; if so, what action does the Government propose taking to give effect to the Commissioner's findings.

7. MR. BAIRD: To ask the Honorable the Minister of Public Instruction—

1. How many senior art positions in technical schools have been filled without being advertised during the last four years.
2. If this practice will apply to the appointment of the proposed new principal of the art school at the Workingmen's College and the appointment of an art inspector to succeed Mr. Carew-Smyth, who is about to retire.
3. How many technical art teachers not previously employed in the Education Department with qualifications other than those of the Victorian Education Department have been appointed to senior positions in technical and art schools during the last fifteen years.
4. If it is a fact that many of our art schools have not had a visit from the art inspector for periods extending at times from five to ten years, and that no official reports on the work have been supplied to the councils or the teachers.
5. If the teachers appointed with outside qualifications have been unsatisfactory, and if they have been transferred to minor positions in other schools.
6. If it is a fact that, although the examinations are held in November and December, students often have to wait from five to eight months before the results are made known by the Department.

8. MR. McADAM: To ask the Honorable the Minister of Railways what is the number of railway pensioners who are receiving £156 pension per year or under.

9. MR. DUNSTAN: To ask the Honorable the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey—

1. The number of prosecutions instituted under the noxious weeds provisions of the Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act since the present Act came into operation.

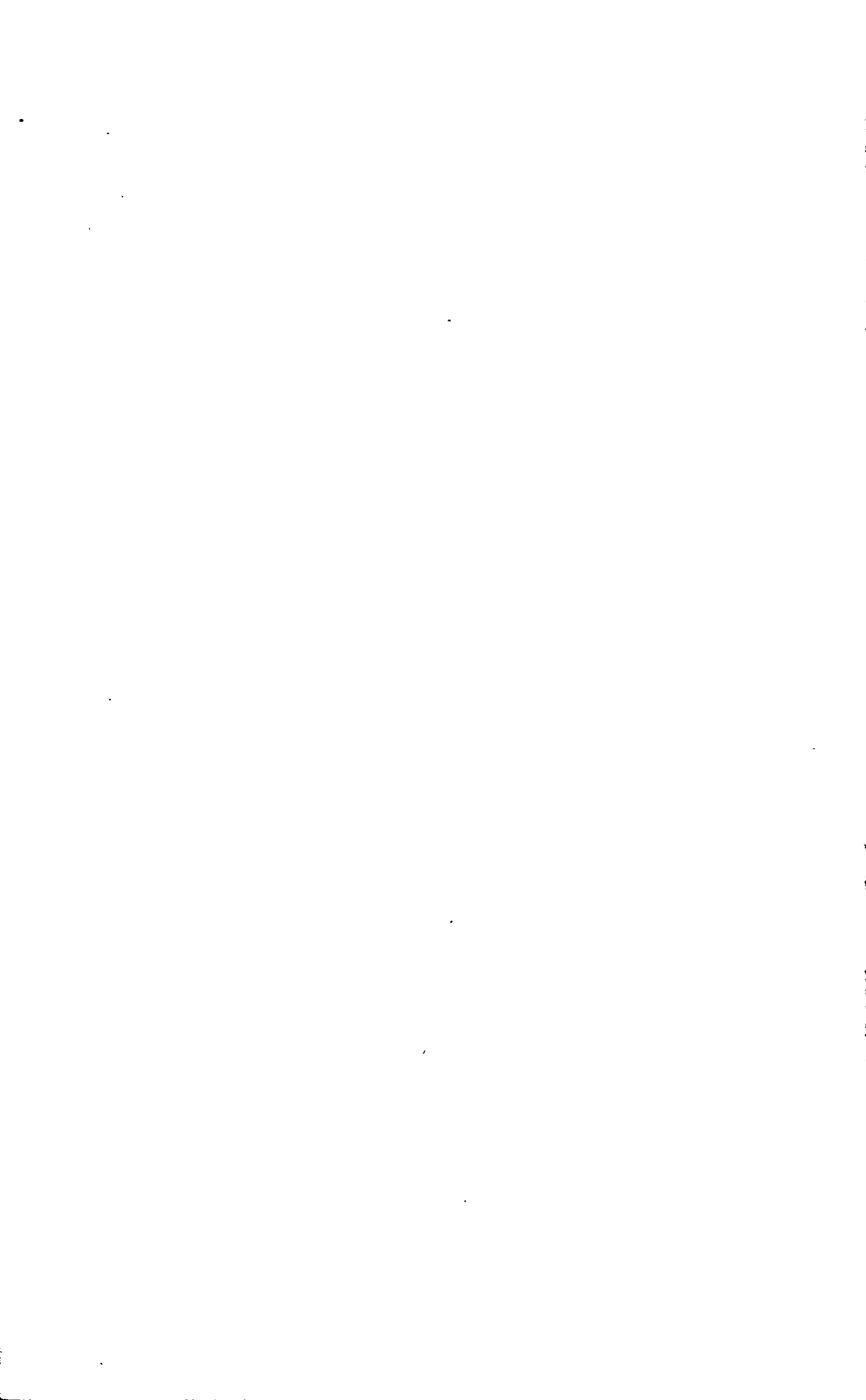
