NOTES.

1. *Period of Membership.*—Under the *Electoral Provinces and Districts Act* 1965 No. 7270, which provided *inter alia* for the redivision of the southern area of Victoria into Electoral Provinces for the Legislative Council, the total number of Provinces was increased from 17 to 18, each returning 2 Members. The Act also provided that the redivision should not affect those Members due to retire in 1970. Therefore, until 1970 the Council shall consist of 17 Members due to retire in that year, and 18 Members elected in 1967.

In 1966 Parliament passed *The Constitution Act Amendment (Conjoint Elections) Act* 1966 No. 7462, which provided that a joint election for the Council and the Assembly could be held within three months immediately prior to 15th July, 1967—the day after the next ensuing date upon which one-half of the Members of the Council were due to retire by effluxion of time.

This election was duly held on 29th April, 1967, and in order to define clearly the period of membership of Council Members elected thereat Parliament passed *The Constitution Act Amendment (Electoral) Act* 1967 No. 7532, which provided that, where a poll at a periodical election is taken before the date on which one-half of the Members are due to retire by effluxion of time, the period shall be from and including the day after the date when such retirement is due.

2. *Classification of Provinces.*—As a result of the redivision of Electoral Provinces, the Governor in Council by Proclamation issued under the provisions of section 32 (3) of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act* 1958 No. 6224, made certain alterations in the classifications of Provinces.

The previous classifications were as follows :—

Metropolitan.—Doutta Galla, East Yarra, Higinbotham, Melbourne, Melbourne North, Melbourne West, Monash ;

Urban.—Ballaarat, Bendigo, Southern, South-Eastern, South-Western ;

Inner Country.—Northern, North-Eastern, Western ; and

Outer Country.—Gippsland, North-Western.

Alterations made were—*Metropolitan to Urban.*—Doutta Galla and Melbourne West ; *New Urban.*—Boronia and Templestowe ; *Urban to Inner Country.*—Ballaarat, Bendigo, South-Eastern and South-Western ; and *Inner Country to Outer Country.*—North-Eastern and Western.

The reclassifications were for the period from 15th July, 1967, until the date of the retirement by effluxion of time of those Members due to retire in 1970 and the alterations applied as follows :—

In the cases of Doutta Galla, Melbourne West and South-Eastern—only to the Members elected in 1967.

In the cases of Ballaarat, Bendigo, North-Eastern, South-Western and Western—to each Member, as these Provinces were not the subject of redivision.
