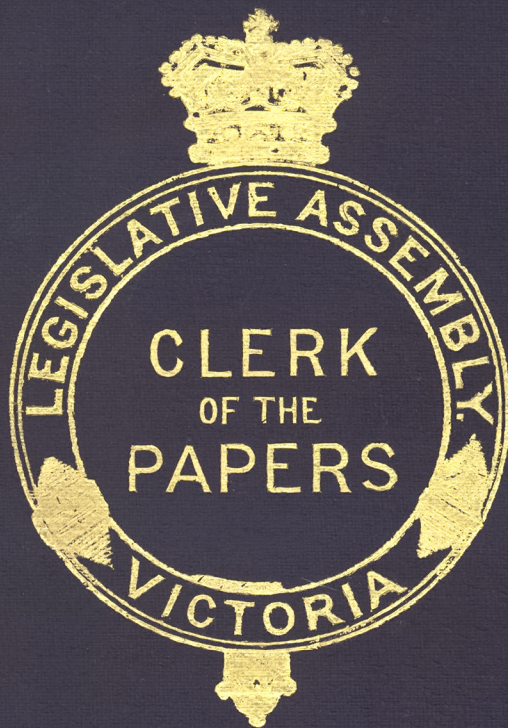

1. **MR. GUYE:** To ask the Honorable J. G. B. McDonald, Honorary Minister, for the Honorable the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey—
 1. If, in view of the fact that rabbits have assumed plague proportions in the Dreeite, Dreeite North, Dreeite South, Wool Wool, and adjacent districts, it is the intention of the Lands Department to proceed against a number of farmers in these districts for failing to destroy rabbits.
 2. If so, how many prosecutions are pending.
 3. If consideration has been given to the serious position of landowners in these districts by reason of the shortage of manpower.
 4. If so, what steps it is proposed to take to assist landowners in this time of national emergency.

1. MR. HAYES: To move, That, in view of the shortage of hospital accommodation and the lack of financial assistance, it is the opinion of this House that hospital control should be nationalized and a committee set up to advise the Government on such proposal.
2. MR. CORRIGAN: To move, That, in the opinion of this House, the present State housing scheme should provide for compensation to be paid to house-owners whose houses are demolished by order of the authorities.
3. MR. MICHAELIS: To move, That a Select Committee be appointed to inquire into and report upon the recent outbreak of typhoid fever in the metropolitan area; such Committee to consist of seven members, with power to send for persons, papers, and records, to sit on days on which the House does not meet, and to report the minutes of evidence from time to time; four to be the quorum.
