SECOND SESSION OF THE FIFTIETH PARLIAMENT

(24 February 1987 to 29 August 1988)

PROVINCES AND TENURE OF MEMBERS

- Victoria was divided into 22 Provinces each of which returned two members to the Council [*Constitution Act 1975*, section 27(1)].
- A Member of the Council was entitled to hold his seat from the date appointed for taking the poll (periodical election date) until the expiration or dissolution of the second Legislative Assembly after he had been elected [*Constitution Act 1975*, section 28(1) and (2)].
- In the redistribution of electoral boundaries in 1985, the Provinces of Bendigo and Thomastown were abolished and those of Eumemmerring and Jika Jika were created. Each of those four Provinces were therefore represented by only one Member of the Council during Session 1987-88.
- Members whose date of retirement by effluxion of time was 26 June 1988 were entitled to hold their seats until after the dissolution of the Legislative Assembly elected on 2 March 1985 [*Constitution Act 1975*, section 28(5)]. Such dissolution occurred on 29 August 1988.
